


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Introduction:

This report serves as an addendum to the Navajo County Community Health Status Assessment (CHSA) dated January of 2010. In most cases, the original data table from the 2010 report is reproduced here with an updated table below. The scope of the project was to update all data where current secondary sources of information existed. In a few instances, the research team did obtain primary data by telephone calls.

The Center for Rural Health was contracted to identify and update as many of the original tables contained in the 2010 CHSA as possible. A total of 100 tables were identified as being probable candidates for having updated information publically available. Available secondary data analyses, and some phone calls, yielded updated information in 77 of those tables. In some cases, raw data were available; however time constraints placed limitations upon the statistical analyses that were done. A list of tables in which current information was not readily available is contained in the appendix.

In reviewing the 77 tables contained in this report, we would like to provide the following notes:

- Our researchers noticed some issues with data from the original report. In these cases, an explanation of the inconsistency will appear in italics below the table title. There also may be highlighted data to draw attention to the inconsistency (e.g., Table 1.2).
- "Old" and "new" tables may not be formatted in the same way, or there may be more or less information provided in one than in another (e.g., Table 11.0). The availability of public data evolves. We attempted to use the original sources first. If those data were not updated or unavailable, we sought alternative sources. In a few instances, multiple tables are combined into one (e.g., Table 10.6/7/8/9).
- Data presented in the "new" tables may be formatted differently from the original table to highlight Navajo County data as opposed to Arizona or national data (e.g., Table 8.7).
- Some data sets did not allow for frequency calculations (e.g., Table 5.6) and the definitions of the categories utilized in the original table (e.g., not at risk, at risk, unsure) were unclear. In these cases, we reported prevalence data on the health risk of interest.
- In reviewing the data in the new tables versus the old tables, it does not appear that there are significant differences between the two, but the updated data should contribute towards the next steps in developing a community health improvement plan for Navajo County.





Table 2.2 Unemployment Trends: Navajo County, Arizona, and Arizona Native American Reservation, 2004-2012^{1,2}




Figure 5.2 Percentage of 8th Grade Respondents Who Used ATODs During the Past 30 Days, Navajo County, 2006-2010¹ (NEW)


Figure 5.3 Percentage of 10th Grade Respondents Who Used ATODs During the Past 30 Days, Navajo County, 2006-2010¹ (NEW)
