BLUE CHIP JOB GROWTH HIGHLIGHTS

January 2009 vs. January 2008

In the U.S. economy:

- The U.S. economy contracted by 3,493,000 nonagricultural jobs in January 2009 over January 2008, a 2.57 percent decrease (page 1).
- The goods producing sector contracted by 1,816,000 jobs, an 8.49 percent decrease in January 2009 compared to January 2008 (page 2).
- The service providing sector contracted by 1,677,000 jobs in January 2009 over January 2008, a 1.47 percent decrease (page 3).

Among the states:

- Wyoming holds the number one rank in total nonagricultural job growth in January 2009 over January 2008, with a 2.17 percent increase representing 6,200 jobs (page 1).
- The lowest rate of total nonagricultural job growth for January 2009 compared to January 2008 was in Michigan, with a 6.37 percent decrease (-264,100 jobs) (page 1).
- The Louisiana construction and mining sector recorded 5.62 percent job growth in January 2009 compared to January 2008 (10,300 jobs) (page 4).
- Indiana recorded 4.56 percent job growth in the educational and health services sector in January 2009, which represents 18,300 jobs (page 11).
- Oklahoma recorded 3.58 percent job growth in the Leisure and Hospitality services sector in January 2009, which represents 4,900 jobs (page 12).

Among the metro areas:

- In metropolitan markets with under 1,000,000 workers, the Odessa, Texas metropolitan area ranked first in nonagricultural job growth for January 2009 over January 2008, posting a 5.05 percent gain, which represented 3,100 jobs.
- Among metropolitan markets with a workforce of over 1,000,000, the Houston, Baytown, Sugar Land, Texas metropolitan area had the highest rate of growth in nonagricultural employment for January 2009 over January 2008, posting a 0.67 percent gain, which represented 17,200 jobs.
