PROPOSED CODE OF ETHICS

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WHEREAS, The Arizona State Music Teachers' Association was formed for the purpose of maintaining musical standards and improving relations among music teachers and students in the state of Arizona.

BE IT RESOLVED, That the following code of ethics shall be adopted and practiced:

ARTICLE I. That members of the Association and their students, when advertising or in interviews must mention all previous teachers.

ARTICLE II. That members of the Association shall not offer free, partial, or fictitious scholarships as a means to secure pupils.

ARTICLE III. That members of the Association shall be honest at all times with pupils and their parents, as to a pupil's talent, ability and progress.

ARTICLE IV. That members of the Associaion shall make no overtures to any pupil who already has a teacher.

ARTICLE V. That the pupil shall be held responsible for his appointments except in case of emergency.

ARTICLE VI. That any pupil who has failed to pay his just indebtedness shall be reported to the Association and shall not be accepted by any other member until his debt is paid.

ARTICLE VII. That the minimum fee for one (1) hour private instruction shall not be less than \$2.00.

ARTICLE VIII. That members of the Association shall use only the most conservative statements in advertising. Statements of a degree must be accompanied by the name of the institution granting said degree.

ARTICLE IX. That unwarranted criticism by one teacher of another tends to destroy confidence in and respect for the music teaching profession and shall be discouraged.

ARTICLE X. That members of the Association desiring to maintain professional relations with their local high school shall cooperate in every way possible with the school authorities by supplying promptly and completely all information and reports asked of them. Members will not publicly or privately discuss school officials' management of musical affairs except with the proper authorities.

ARTICLE XI. That the Association does not favor public school teachers giving private lessons except where there is a lack of qualified private teachers.

mands that all fundamentals be included in lessons given students taking music for credit. That specifies scales, chords, arpeggios, modulations and sight reading besides studies and pieces from each musical period—classic, romantic and modern.

Allowing credit for outside music in the High Schools has shown where the weaknesses have been in teaching at the pre-school and grade school levels. To help correct these deficiencies, the ASMTA compiled an outline of piano teaching materials from pre-school through the grade school levels to High School. This included recommendations regarding the amount of harmony and technic that should be taught through the different stages of musical development. These suggestions were down to earth results from research among successful teachers thruout the country who frankly disclosed the progress they expected at given levels. No teacher is bound by the outline but can turn to it if in need of guidance from experienced colleagues.

Many famous teachers have given clinics in Arizona. However, the piano clinic given by Dr. Raymond Burrows of Columbia University in Phoenix two years ago, has become the model for clinic organization in which the American Music Conference participates. This clinic was planned and sponsored by the ASMTA with the cooperation of Mr. T. L. Hoff, Phoenix College, music dealers and the Board of Education. The undertaking involved expenditures no one group could have

financed alone but with the dealers bringing in quantities of materials needed; the college giving housing for the clinic and allowing credit for attendance; the State Board of Education accepting the credits toward certificates or renewal of certificates; and the ASMTA sending out letters conveying information concerning the project and putting the weight of their organization back of it, the clinic was successful from every angle.

A clinic for both violin and piano was given last year with Rose McHugh and Dr. Ernest Harris from Columbia conducting the sessions. There already is a demand for clinics this year. Teachers in Arizona do not need clinics from the standpoint that they have less preparation for their work than those of other states, but they wish clinics and other means of exchange of ideas with colleagues who are the best in their profession.

Arizona teachers are determined to have and keep the highest standards in music teaching. They now have the means—the outline of teaching materials to guide any teacher from preschool to High School, and credit for private music lessons in High Schools. The High School music course follows the Specimen Examinations put out by the National Association of Schools of Music.

The grade schools, High Schools and colleges of Arizona have music faculties of fine calibre. Many take active parts in National music organizations, serving as officers and giving demonstrations at Conferences.

Tucson has a symphony orchestra

composed of volunteer players who give good concerts. Phoenix has a professional, paid Symphony with a nationally known conductor. An extensive educational program is carried on in the public schools by the Phoenix Symphony.

Arizona now presents a musical panorama which includes a demand even in rural areas, for certified private music teachers; public school music on a par with that of the best; growing interest in ASMTA., MTNA and Music Education Conference; and a definite widening of musical horizons for larger participation in national and world musical advancement.

In broadening its scope, it is to be hoped that Arizona will keep that sincerity and spirit of professional tolerance which led one noted musician to remark, "I have never seen such a friendly attitude in a teachers' group. During the whole time I have been here, I have never heard any teacher make a detrimental remark about another teacher or his work." With such a feeling of unity, Arizona can look forward to certain fulfillment of its ideals.

It is the first performance of an idea Oliver LaFarge has wanted to present for many years and it promises to be a spectacle of great beauty. By doing so you will get better seats than if you wait until the evening performance.

The Phoenix Symphony Orchestra with Bidu Sayo, Brazilian born Soprano from the Metropolitan Opera will be the Tucson Festival feature for Saturday night. You may want to be in Tucson the night before the convention to enjoy this program.

The ASMTA fiscal year has been changed from April 1 to September 1 to conform to that of the Music Teachers National Associations; thus, the present board has been operating on an 18-month budget with a 12-month income.

Although members have been credited with payment of dues to September 1, 1951, it would help greatly if you could pay 1951-52 dues at the convention. You will then be credited with payment to September 1, 1952.

Music Teacher Directories for the Central District have been printed and distributed at various meetings, ASMTA members living in the Central District can get their copies from Victor Baumann at Phoenix College. If you want them mailed to you, please enclose a 3¢ stamp. The Central District cannot afford the postage. These have been given to public schools, dealers who advertised, and to the Chamber of Commerce, as well as to members. Maricopa County schools can get copies at the County Superintendent's Office.

Both Central and Southern Districts have been active with panel meetings and discussions, giving student recitals, and sponsoring clinics — some of which have been reported in earlier membership letters.

Music of the West magazine has made the Association another fine offer. It is a good publication and your subscription can help the ASMTA treasury.

Zoning restrictions in Phoenix were about to prohibit private music from teaching in their own homes. Prompt action through the leadership of Mrs. Luther Steward and cooperation of those in music teacher organizations brought a reconsideration which leaves the music teachers unmolested — at least temporarily. Such a restriction could have effected the work of private teachers in any residential area by establishing a precedent. We owe lawyer Edwin Beauchamp more than a vote of thanks for his time and efforts on the matter.


