LAUER, CHARLES W.

LAUER, CHARLES W., born in Germany, about 1829; listed,
U. S. Census, 1860, at an Overland stage station between Tucson
and the Pima Villages, age 31, occupation - Hostler; enlisted
August 10, 1861, at Fort Fillmore, New Mexico, and served in
the Confederate Army as Private, Captain Pyron's Company B,
2d Texas Mounted Riflemen also known as Captain David Poor's
Company, 2d Texas Mounted Volunteers; killed in action at La
Fourche Crossing, Louisiana, June 21, 1863.

He was a resident and citizen of Pima County, A.T., and owned a house and lot on the south side of the Military Plaza in Tucson which was sold at public auction for \$405 on March 4, 1872, by order of the Probate Court.
