Thompson, PETER

THOMPSON, PETER, born in Molmes County, Ohio, about 1831; probably a son of John and Sarah Thompson; never married; enrolled August 16, at Jackson, Amador County, California, and mustered in August 26, 1861, at the Presidio of San Francisce to serve 3 years as Private, Company C. 1st California Infantry; occupation when enlisted, Miner; left Fort Tuma April 19, crossed southern Arisena with the California Column and arrived at Mesilla, H.M., August 13, 1862; left Fort Wingate with the Company in Movember, 1863, and arrived at Fort Whipple, A.T., in January 1864; listed Territorial Census, April 1864, at Fort Whipple, A.T., occupation, Soldier; was on detached service at La Pas, A.T., from June 9, 1864; honorably discharged at Lee Pinos, N.M., August 31, 1864.

Private. Company K. 9th Kansas Cavalry; honorably discharged at De Valls
Bluff, Arkansas, July 17, 1865; returned to Yavapai County in 1867; listed
U.S. Census, July 1870, at Big Bug, Yavapai County, A.T., occupation, Brickmaker; member, Aztlan Lodge No. 1, F. & A.M. Prescott; the Prescott Morning
Courier of December 15, 1887, said of him:

"Pete" Thompson, a pioneer of 163 has come in from the mountains. The old pioneer isn't as young as when he carried a U.S. musket and chased Indians. He spoke of the time when he and Judge Jown Howard, another 163 "boy", came near perishing for water.

Died at Prescott, Yavapai County, A.T., March 28, 1891, aged 60; buried, Masonic Cemetery, Prescott, Arizona.
