My dear Mr. Rees: I received your letter sometime ago protesting against the establishment of a National Park at the Grand Canyon along the lines suggested by the Secretary of the Interior. In your letter you stated that Mr. Woolfolk would write me at length in regard to this matter but as yet I have heard nothing from him. I understand that there is a move on foot to transfer the Grand Canyon National Monument to the Department of the Interior without changing its present limitations.
