My dear Mr. Woolfolk:

I am in receipt of your letter of February /3 6. and am glas now that the Board of Sunoppiaces approves of the bill to establish the Grand Canyon National Park. I called this measure up in the Committee on the Public and westerday but the Committee decided not to report at this session of Congress because it is impossible to pass any new legislation between now and the 4th of March. Senator Ashurst, however has succeeded in obtaining a favorable report from the Senate Committee on Public Lands, of which I enclose a copy. I find that there is practically no opposition to the establishment of a National Park at the Grand Canyon, so that it will be easy to obtain consideration for a silliar will which I shall introduce in the next Congress.
