DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR NATIONAL PARK SERVICE July 25th 1924 Dear Mr. Bakins Referring to your letter of May 31st regarding the item in the current Interior Department appropriation act authorising the purchase of the Bright Angel Toll Road and Trail, I am inclosing herewith copy of a memorandum dated July 18, 1924, approved by First Assistant Secretary Pinney, covering the procedure to be followed in negotiating for the purchase of this tell road and trail. The estimate suggested by Congressman Hayden covering the construction of the approach road has been changed to \$100,000, as approved, and included in the tentative estimates for the fiscal year 1926 submitted to the Bureau of the Budget by this Department. Director Mather has given instructions for you to take up with the proper efficials of Cocomino County the matter of the purchase of the road and trail at the earliest practicable date on the basis of the inclosed memorandum and to keep this office and Field Assistant Albright fully advised of the progress of the negotiations. While Director Mather is in the field this office will keep him telegraphically advised of the progress of those negotiations as reported by you.
