You possibly know also that we are spending about \$20,000.00 in putting up a new store building adjoining the new civic center at the Canyon. In order to make this venture a success we, of course, are vitally interested in securing for this store all of the business we possibly can and, consequently, are very much interested in any improvements at the Canyon that might bring about the desired results. One of the best drawing cards for a place like Grand Canyon is to our way of thinking the postoffice. It is now located a long ways distant from the new civic center, and our store being there it would mean so much to us if it could be arranged so the postoffice might be transferred to a location set aside for it in the new civic center. Knowing that your influence in such matters is very great, and also feeling that you will agree that in the furtherance of the interests of not only ourselves but others that such a move would be advantageous, we sincerely hope that a recommendation along this line will be made by you.
