According to Mr. Crosby's statement, with which I am able to agree because of my own personal knowledge of the situation, there appears to be little cause for Mr. Boyce's fear that the present location jeopardises in any way the safety of the public. In all of the parks in which explosives are used we have endsavored to locate the storage houses or magazines where they would not be a menace to the public, and in this respect I am confident that we have not neglected Grand Canyon.
