My dear Mr. Goodman: Your letter of November 22nd was duly received, and I enclose herewith copy of a letter which I wrote to the Director of the National Park Service, and to which the Pines Assistant Secretary of the Interior as replied. After you have read Judge Finney's letter, I shall be greatly obliged if you will further advise me relative to this matter. I also enclose letter that I have received from the Forest Service relative to the Oak Creek Road, which states that no action can be taken until the amount of next years Forest road appropriation is known. Sometime ago I talked with the Chief of the Forest Service relative to this road and I am sure that is \$6,500,000 is made available for Forest roads and trails, that he will be able to find a way to allot the necessary funds for the construction of this project.
