My dear Sir:

I am in receipt of a letter from Bishop
Walter Mitchell of Phoenix, Arizona, which reads in
part as follows:

"I spent last week at the Grand Canyon.
The Church forces there, representing I do
not know how many denominations, are all
agreed that they must have a union Chapel.
As I understand it, they expect to put up
the money, but, not having enough, want to
know if CCC labor, (there are two camps right
there, you know, and the boys would profit by
the presence of the chapel), could not be
allowed to give their labor? The site is,
of course, within the Park area and control.
How should we go about it? That is, securing
the site and the labor?"

I shall appreciate hearing from you as to
whether CCC labor can be assigned for the construction
of this proposed chapel.
