I have your note of July 3 with the suggested amendments to the Grand Canyon National Park bill. I have discussed these amendments informally with the Secretary, and I understand that they are satisfactory to him. He stated that he had no objection to the amendment authorizing the Secretary of the Interior to grant railroad rights of way.

I understand that you are going to eliminate the section calling for the revocation of the Executive Order creating the Grand Canyon National Monument. but that you will insert a clause that such part of the Grand Canyon National Game Preserve as is included within the Grand Canyon National Park is to be eliminated from said game preserve.

I would suggest y have your amendments presented to the Pub. the hill wir meet morestel wonders sant p by the Committee to the Department for consideration, and it will then come to the Secretary for a formal report.
