## A BILL

To establish the Grand Canyon National Park in the State of Arizona.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 lives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3 That there is hereby reserved and withdrawn from settle-
4 ment, occupancy, or disposal under the laws of the United
5 States and dedicated and set apart as a public park for the
6 benefit and enjoyment of the people, under the name of the
7 "Grand Canyon National Park," the tract of land in the
8 State of Arizona particularly described by and included
9 within metes and bounds as follows, to wit:

That the administration, protection, and pro15 motion of said Grand Canyon National Park shall be exer16 cised, under the direction of the Secretary of the Interior, 17 by the National Park Service, subject to the provisions of the 18 Act of August twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and sixteen, 19 entitled "An Act to establish a National Park Service, and 20 for other purposes.": Provided, That all concessions for 21 hotels, camps, transportation, and other privileges of every 22 kind and nature for the accommodation or entertainment 23 of visitors shall be let at public bidding to the best and most 24 responsible bidder.

SEC. 7. That the Inited Sternmation Sevviee. may enter upon and utilize-for-flowage-over-purposes any area within-said-park whieh-may be-neeessay for the-deFelopment maintenance of a Government-reelamation projee That, whenever consistent with the primary purposes of said park, the Secretary of the Interior is authorized to permit the utilization of areas therein which may be necessary for the development and maintenance of a

SEC. 8. That where privately owned lands within the said park lie within three hundred feet of the rim of the Grand Canyon no building, tent, fence, or other structure shall be erected on the park lands lying between said
