

THE PRIDE congratulates Jakki on his fine accomplishments and is proud to have him on our staff.





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#### KELLEY YORK VISITS MISS MATTY'S ATTIC

#### AFTER YOU'RE OUT

AFTER YOU'RE OUT is an anthology of articles dealing with the realities of being out of the closet and living your life openly as a Gay person.

The first line of the Forward sets the tone for the whole book: "Once upon a time, there was the closet. Inside the closet, I hid." Unfortunately, coming out does not provide one with instant happiness. (although truth-telling is usually a liberating rush) — But usually presents one with a whole different set of situations and problems to deal with. Those situations and problems are what this book is about.

It's divided up into three parts: Identity and Lifestyle, Survival in a Hostile World, and Creating Community and Helping Ourselves. Authors of the articles include the book's editors, Allen Young and Karla Jay, plus many other well-known, and some not-sowell-known, movement activists.

Under the Identity and Lifestyles section are articles about human identity vs. Gay identity, bisexuality, gay couples, monogomy vs. non-monogomy, and role-playing. Part Two, Survival in a Hostile World, deals with Lesbian mothers, faggot fathers, gay prisoners, gay couples and straight law, being out at work and prostitution. Creating Community and Helping Ourselves discusses those issues particular to Gay Life: Can Gay men and women work together and should they? Aging, alcoholism, VD, political correctness, gay therapy as big business. . . Humor is combined with practicality and evidenced in some of the titles of the essays: "How to Come Out Without Being Thrown Out," "We'd All Better Hang Together or Surely We'll All Hang Separately".

AFTER YOU'RE OUT is a book that would be of help to any Gay who sometimes gets depressed about the state of life outside the closet, or to any Gay who is considering expanding the closet walls a little further At the very least, it's food for thought.

#### MEN LOVING MEN

MEN LOVING MEN is for men who want to explore their gayness and open up to new aspects of themselves. It's a complete sex guide and includes pictures, drawings, and discussion about all the aspects of male homosexuality. Each chapter sensitively details the different kinds of sex, plus what you can do about possible hang-ups and sexual fears. Also included is a chapter on gay health problems. There's a photo essay which captures the spirit of loving men, and a short historical survey of gay male sex in past times and other cultures. MEN LOV-ING MEN is for experienced lovers, those just coming out and for all men who want to expand their joy and understanding.

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
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



Talk of the Town has always been noted for it's pleasing atmosphere and the terrific people who work to make it the bar it is.


Soon the ranks of bartender will be joined by Pam and Eileen. We're sure they will be a pleasant addition.





I pretty well covered the bar last month, so I'll let the pictures (taken by PRIDE staff photographer, Ed Kates)


speak for themselves. I really enjoyed covering this truly fun event - so much fun, in fact, that my old man had to demand that we leave.





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
