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Gay Birds?

SANTA BARBARA ISL., CA. (AP)

Scientists visited this island to learn why some gulls make better parents than others. They stayed to find out why some gulls don't become parents at all — they're homosexual.

"We're absolutely incredulous," said Dr. George L. Hunt, Jr., a member of the University of California at Irvine research team that has studied 1200 pairs of Western Gulls since 1974.

"This sort of thing has not been found before (in wild birds) and was clearly not what we anticipated," Hunt said.

"This is the first case (among wild birds) of homosexual pairs in which everything except copulation is done as if they were normal pairs," said Dr. Donald Farner, professor of Zoophysical at the University of Washington. Scientists had previously discovered evidence of homosexuality among other animals, including dogs.

Farner, whose team has taken blood samples from several hundred birds to see if hormones are responsible for the homosexuality, said the gulls "incubate eggs, defend their territory, and one of the females behaves as if she were the male in courtship."

Farner said the homosexuality in every case involves lesbian rather than male homosexual behavior. Females outnumber males on the island. Homosexuality was recently discovered among male ducks at the Stanley Park Zoo in Vancouver, B.C., where there is a shortage of female ducks, according to Zoo Curator, Stanley LeSage.

On one-square mile Santa Barbara Island, teams from UC Irvine and the University of Washington are studying the cause of homosexuality under a 2-year National Science Foundation Grant. A foundation spokesman said that the study should provide some useful insights into the problems of the environment. The birds' home island, 43 miles off the coast of Los Angeles, is a part of Channel Islands National Monument and is inhabited by a Park Ranger and occassional overnight campers.

The homosexuality was discovered by accident after the Irvine team arrived in 1974 to conduct its research into parenting. The researchers found that 8% to 14% of the nests contained four or more eggs instead of the maximum of 3 eggs. The oddity caused researchers to temporarily abandon their original mission. They discovered that some nests were inhabited by two females, each laying 2-3 infertile eggs. They found that some of the all-female couples formed stable unions which lasted through consecutive breeding seasons.

"So far we have only a phenomenon on hand," Hunt said, "we don't really know why this is happening."



GAY ATHLETES FIGHT ANITA

NEW YORK (AP) An organization of homosexual athletes announced a \$100,000 national advertising campaign against Florida Citrus products after the Florida Citrus Commission's decision to renew Anita Bryant's contract.

Craig Liebermann, a spokesman for the International Union of Gay Athletes said the bulk of the money for the campaign was donated by professional athletes, whom he would not identify.

"We plan to alert people who are concerned to which citrus products come out of Florida, and to encourage them to boycott those products," Liebermann said.

A national consumer study conducted before the commission's vote showed that 44% of the nation's households disapproved of Miss Bryant's campaign against homosexuals, and those households account for 52% of orange juice sales.

holds account for 52% of orange juice sales.

Liebermann said his group, which he said consists of 4400 college and professional athletes on four continents, has refused the opportunity to meet with the commission before they extended Bryant her new contract running through 1979.

The commission also commended Miss Bryant for her "courageous leadership on a moral issue."





An NBC spokesman said the decision to replace Miss Bryant with RITA MORENO was "unrelated to any publicity or controversy about Anita Bryant."



The books reviewed in this column are available from Womans-place Books — 2401 N. 32nd Street, Phoenix, 956-0456. THE PRIDE suggests that when you are looking for books and magazines, check WOMANSPLACE first. —And guys, don't let the name fool you!

THE JOY OF GAY SEX, ed. by Ed White and Dr. Charles Silverstein, and THE JOY OF LESBIAN SEX, ed. by Bertha Harris and Dr. Emily Sisley, \$12.95 each.

Companion volumes which depict in words and pictures everything the contemporary gay person, male and female, faces in their quest for love and fulfillment. A guide to the erotic, emotional and social fulfillment of a homosexual/lesbian lifestyle, both volumes exceptionally well-illustrated.

THE OTHER PERSUASION, ed. by Seymour Kleinberg, \$3.95 A short fiction about gay men and women. Includes works by Radclyffe Hall, E.M. Forster, William Faulkner, Christopher Isherwood, Jane Rule, Gore Vidal and many others. "One purpose of this collection is to assist definition (of gay) by exploring some meanings of the experience that the word has connotated in the past and by noting the changes in meaning as we approach the present."

THE LESBIAN MYTH, by Bettie Wysor, \$3.50

The condemnation of lesbianism is explored through the insights and conversations concerning sexual bigotry and its varied aspects: Biblical misinterpretation, ignorance of clinical anthropology, indifference and sexism in psychiatry, and literary role-playing. Dialogue on motherhood, lesbian lifestyle and sexuality.

I HAVE MORE FUN WITH YOU THAN ANYBODY, by Lige Clark and Jack Nichols, \$7.95.

A lighthearted and sensitive appreciation of life by two long-time gay activists. Editors of the now-defunct publication, GAY, they explore the myth of the tortured homosexual by their own examples and experiences, from gay nightlife in New York to their trips to gay meccas all over North America.

Other items to note: ONE FOR THE GODS by Gordon Merrick is back in print, \$2.25. FAMILIAR FACES, HIDDEN LIVES, by Howard Brown is now available in paperback, \$2.95 CHRISTOPHER AND HIS KIND, by Christopher Isherwood has just arrived, \$2.75.

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CONFERENCE IN HOUSTON ONE PERSPECTIVE

Approximately 11,000 women met in Houston from November 18th to 21st for the purpose of voting on numerous proposals, the results of which will tell the federal government, finally, after all these years, what women really want.

Betty Friedan, long-time feminist who is notorious for opposing discussion of lesbianism in the women's movement, announced her change of heart on national TV, and spoke in support of the sexual preference resolution which included civil rights for lesbians.

The conference delegates passed every resolution except the last one — they ran out of time. All of the resolutions were very women-oriented — recommendations to provide shelters for battered women and children, abortion by choice, health care, passage of the ERA, etc.

There were some sobering moments, though. The Indiana delegation voted against every resolution. The KKKers and Phyllis Schaffly's Eagle Forum people were there. (They didn't appear at their booths in the exhibit area after the first day, having given up after being repeatedly confronted with "But why are you against the ERA?")

The National Women's Conference was a success. The acheivement of all those women being there, voting on women's issues, will be an historical marker comparable to that of Seneca Falls Convention last century.



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Homosexual ring that used boys cracked; 15 held

BOSTON — At least 15 men — including a mechanic, a psychiatrist and a former assistant headmaster of an exclusive boys' school — were arrested Thursday in what authorities called a ring where homosexuals from around the nation staged sordid parties with boys as young as 9.

"This is a bunch of guys who liked to get together and party with littic boys," said Assistant Suffolk County District Attorney Thomas E. Peisch. "This is sex for hire... People patronizing it came from all over the country."

He said the ring, operating out of a home in Revere, just north of Boston, came to the attention of police earlier

this year when a school bus driver was convicted of raping young boys. In the ensuing investigation, 17 men were labeled as members of the ring and seven others were named as engaging in child sex in incidents not directly tied to the ring.

With secret indictments, police on Thursday started a series of dawn arrests, rounding up suspects here, in New York and Georgia. Men were sought in five other states.

Of 15 men arrested Wednesday, nine were arraigned in Suffolk Superior Court, and all pleaded innocent.


The suspects, handcuffed together and some wearing business suits, covered their faces as they piled out of police wagons to be booked on charges that officials said went back over several years that the sex ring was operating.

The youngsters, ranging from 9 to 15, were paid \$5 to engage in oral sex with the men and \$25 to engage in a n a l intercourse, officials said. The boys, many of them homeless, were said to have been willing partners, but reportedly had been plied with beer and marijuana and had been shown stag films at the Revere home.

"We found 100 pictures of naked boys," said District Attorney Garrett Byrne, telling of the modest three story apartment house where the sex ring was believed centered.

Among those arrested were Arthur Clarridge, described as in his mid-40's, a former math teacher and assistant headmaster at the Fessenden School for boys; and James Dallman, 35, an English teacher at the school, Peisch said.

Others arrested, according to Peisch, were Dr. Donald Allen, a psychiatrist from the fashionable section of Boston's Back Bay; Edward Mede, operator of a judo and karate school; and Roger Spear, 44, an investment counselor from Wellesley, a wealthy suburb of Boston.





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
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
