What Is Gay Pride Week?

GAY PRIDE WEEK is celebrated during the week surrounding June 29. Last year GPW in Phoenix was 11 days long, running from June 24 thru July 4. This year, GPW '78 is from June 24 thru June 30. The dates vary from year to year and from city to city. In Tucson, they have a GAY PRIDE DAY. In New York, GPW may run 10 days. It is up to each city to coordinate its own activities and its own schedule.

The reason GPW occurs around June 29 is to commemorate events which occured on June 29. Nine years ago in New York's gay bar, the Stonewall, the gays finally stopped letting the police harass them and they stood up for their rights and they fought back. That was the Stonewall Riots on June 29, 1969, the beginning of the modern Gay Rights Movement. The MCC building in New Orleans was burned on June 29 several years ago. Robert Hillsborough, a gay gardner, was killed in San Francisco on June 22, 1977. Richard Heakin was murdered in Tucson two years ago in June when he was leaving a gay bar.

GAY PRIDE WEEK/DAY happens because we, as gays, NEED to acknowledge our existance. We NEED to stand up and say, "WE ARE GAY AND WE ARE PROUD", "We are People". We NEED to express ourselves in an open and orderly way. We must work together, express ourselves, come out of the closet for one week out of the 52.

This year, GAY PRIDE WEEK is being coordinated by The Information Network. We have ten organizations working together to make GAY PRIDE WEEK a success. The bars are cooperating with us. The AGN and The Pride of Phoenix are printing the GAY PRIDE WEEK schedule and flyers. Each group which is having an activity during GPW is working hard to make it a good event.

The groups who are sponsoring events are: Sunday's Childe, MCC, Free Spirit, Imperial Court, CCR, Phoenix Levi & Leather, Sons of Apollo, and the Razzle Dazzle Daze Co. We have included a list which contains the organization and their address in this issue.

There will be a raffle at the Sunday's Childe Picnic/Fair at Encanto Park, Saturday, June 24. The raffle tickets were printed free by the Pride of Phoenix; the prizes were donated by The Connection, Club Phoenix, Hisco Disco, NuTowne, Miss Matty's Attic, Swim & Sea, Diamond Lil's, Casa, Forum, The Unlimited, NOW, and the Womansplace Bookstore. I was very impressed and pleased by the response we received by the businesses that serve the gay community.

The organized gay community is really working hard to make GPW '78 a week to come out for and a week to remember. But all the planning and organization will be for naught if YOU do not show up. PLAN TO BE THERE--YOU ARE NEEDED. Who said that it is too hot in Phoenix in June to do anything? NOT Sunday's Childe. We have a month that is packed full of activities.

Just in case this issue comes out before the end of May, let me tell you what is happening on May 28. From noon to midnight, Phoenix Levi & Leather is sponsoring a Carnival at the Connection. It is open to all. There will be game booths, information tables, voters registration tables, fun and live music from 6 pm. The Connection is 4211 N 7th St.

Also on the 28th of May, Womens Center and the Womansplace Bookstore are co-sponsoring "Hats Off to Women" at Miss Matty's Attic. There will be live and recorded women performers. St Paul, Minn--Voters repealed the GAY RIGHTS SECTION of St Paul's human rights ordinance Tuesday, April 25, approving an initiative by about 2-1. With 140 of the city's 161 precincts counted, there were 46,530 votes in favor of the initiative and 24,989 against. The vote deletes from the human rights ordinance an amendment prohibiting discrimination in housing, employment, education and public accomodations on the basis of "sexual and affectional preference." (Arizona Republic, 4/26/78)

Wichita, Kan--A city ordinance prohibiting discrimination against homosexuals was repealed overwhelmingly Tuesday, May 9, following a pattern of similar referendums in St Paul, Minn and Dade Co, Florida. With all 170 precincts counted, 47,246 votes were in favor of repeal and 10,005 supported retaining the 7-month-old ordinance. About 45% of the city's 128,888 registered voters participated. It was one of the largest turnouts in city history. The outcome came as no surprise to leaders on both sides of the issue. The law was Ordinance No 35-242 which prohibited discrimination in housing, employment and public accomodations based on "sexual and affectional preference." Similar ordinances were repealed by sound margins in Miami last June and St Paul last month, and principals in both campaigns involved themselves in the Wichita vote. A similar election is scheduled for May 23 in Eugene, Ore.

If you've joined the boycott of Fla Orange Products, you have made a healthy move. It turns out that Florida oranges are dyed with Citrus Red 2, a carcinogen, which California oranges do not have. (Lesbian Connection, Vol IV, #1)

We lost again in Eugene, Ore. The unofficial returns last Tuesday, May 23, showed 22,898 votes in favor of repealing the Gay Rights Ordinance, and 13,427 opposed. The count represented 50% of the registered voters in the city. We MUST put an end to this losing!! Dr Nicholas J Flumara, of Boston University School of Medicine, describes in the latest issue of the "Journal of the American Medical Assoc", the results of treating GONORRHEA OF THE RECTUM successfully with high doses of spectinomycin. He describes treating 173 patients with the drug, not commonly used against gonorrhea in any form; 127 who returned were found to be cured. (Advocate, 5/78, #241)

Ohio's only remaining law dealing specifically with gay people has been found unconstitutional, according to Ohio First District Court of Appeals ruling. The law prohibiting gay people from soliciting for sex is unconstitutionally vague and violates the First Amendment because of its "overboard restriction on speech" said the court ruling.

Judge Robert Black, who wrote the decision, pointed out that Ohio's new criminal code no longer prohibits homosexual acts in private between consenting adults. Black said, "If individuals are permitted to engage in consensual acts, reason and consistency say that they shall be allowed to communicate with one another in order to determine whether or not both consent. The two books, <u>Joy of Lesbian</u> <u>Sex</u> and <u>Joy of Gay Sex</u>, have been the basis for criminal charges in at least two cities and subject to a memorandum banning their display in all of B Dalton Bookseller's 300 stores. The books were two of 12 confiscated from three bookstores by police in Lexington, Ky in the city's first enforcement of a new anti-pornography law that prohibits the display of sexually oriented material in places frequented by minors. Last July a memo was sent to all B Dalton stores to "keep the books off the selling floor and show it to adult customers by request

only". In the fall, B Dalton's company bulletin which reviews books included a rave review of Anita Bryant's book with a note on the bottom that said it was ordered for all the stores. (Lesbian Connection, Vol IV,#1)

Nevada and Missouri have filed suit against the National Organization of Women, accusing it of antitrust violations for urging conventions to boycott the states because they have The not ratified the ERA. Missouri suit does not seek damages but asked the court to issue an injuction ordering the group to end its boycott. Meanwhile, the Virginia Attorney General's office is also conducting an investigation to see whether promoting the boycott constitutes an illegal restraint of trade. The national boycott has cost the city of Chicago an estimated \$20 million and Kansas City, Mo, \$8 million. (Lesbian Conn, Vol IV, #1)

About 110 lesbians from various parts of the country attended the founding convention of the proposed National Lesbian Feminist Organization the weekend of March 18 in LA. Plans were made for a national convention to be held during the spring of 1979 in the St Paul-Minneapolis area. Delegates to the national convention will be chosen at state conventions planned to begin this June, and will continue into fall. Each state will be allotted one delegate per every 100 dues paying members of the NLFO who attend the state convention. Membership is open to all lesbians and/or women-identified-women, and dues will be based on individual gross income. It was reported that some lesbians walked out over the decision concerning membership because they wanted membership to be open to lesbians only. We also learned there was some disagreement

over the name chosen for the new organization. Many wanted the organization called the National Lesbian Organization since the word feminist would exclude many lesbians who do not identify themselves as feminists. The founding convention also passed a proposal stating that 50% of all women in decision-making committees must be women of color, and from a variety of class backgrounds.



The Bowling Proprietors Assoc of Louisville, Ky, undertook a new ad campaign recently to get more people to the lanes. Yellow billboards appeared all over town, each one reading "Beat Your Wife" and in smaller letters afterward, "go bowling". Because of the calls and letters of protest to the BPA and to bowling alleys across town, the association decided to change the billboards. Painters were to cross out the word "wife" and write "husband" in its place. The president of the assoc commented that the ad campaign wouldn't be hurt by such action, saying the signs would be "cute, like graffiti." He added, "It would look like a bunch of women's libbers went out there and crawled up in the middle of the night and changed it." In retaliation, local women planned a demonstration, a boycott of bowling, and continued harassment of the bowling lanes.

RECORDINGS/ARTISTS: CONNIE FRANCIS, was in London recently recording her first LP for United Artists. One of the Rock Era's leading female singers, Ms. FRANCIS has racked up 55 chart singles, including three #1's, & 21 charted albums on BILLBOARD's charts. She hasn't done much recording since she was raped on Nov. 8, 1974, devoting much of her time to anti-rape crusades. Welcome back, CONNIL! welcome back JOHNNY MATHIS who's teaming with DENIECE WILLIAMS Also ("FREE") on "Too Much, Too Little, Too Late" is his biggest single of his career. Although he holds the record for most consecutive weeks on the "Hot 100", he never could get above #5 on the chart. An LP is in the works and says MATHIS: "The public won't believe what we've done with this LP." Included the album, MATHIS & WILLIAMS give renditions of 2 MARVIN GAYE/TAMMI TERRELL oldies: "Your Precious Love", "You're All I Need to Get By". New ROLLING STONES LP "Some Girls" has "Miss You" cut issued as a 12" inch disco single. Remember the CHIF-FONS' "He's So Fine"? If not, you'll be able to hear a close copy of it soon. RCA has released a new version of the oldie by KRISTY MC NI-CHOL, star of ABC-TV's "Family", & brother JIMMY, late of "James at 16". Their debut single was produced by the men who cut the original 15 years ago with vocal back-up by the CHIFFONS themselves. The result is a VERY close sound to the '63 hit.

<u>CHART ACTIVITY</u>: "With a Little Bit of Luck" (Wings) this week (5/20) becomes the first non-RSO single to hit #1 on the Hot 100 since Debby Boone's "You Light Up My Life" was on top way back in December. RSO held the top spot for 21 weeks with 6 different singles, FOUR of them from the HIGHLY successful "Saturday Night Fever" soundtrack. This is the sixth #1 for PAUL MC CARTNEY's group since leaving the BEATLES, tieing ELTON JOHN & the BEE GEES for most #1's in the 70's. Speaking of ties, CAROLE KING's "Greatest Hits" album, which recently reached gold status (sales of 500,000 copies), put her into a tie with HELEN REDDY & JONI MITCHELL for second place among female recording artists with the most "gold" records. The trio each have 8 to their credit. Who's in First? Thought you'd never ask . . . BARBRA STREISAND is way out front with 20.

MISC. RAMBLINGS: The LINDA RONSTADT-DOLLY PARTON-EMMYLOU HARRIS LP project has been shelved for the time being. Reason: it was a creative flop. CAROLE BAYER SAGER & MARVIN HAMLISCH who teamed up on the writing of "Nobody Does It Better" are combining their talents again to provide the lyrics & music for NEIL SIMON's new musical, as yet untitled. Lately we've been hearing a lot of talk and campaigning for Muscular Dystrophy in the gay community. On May 6, there was a picnic and Walk-A-Thon held for Muscular Dystrophy. Yet, with all of this publicity, I overheard someone at a recent meeting ask, "What is Muscular Dystrophy anyway?" No one knew. I have discussed writing a medical column for the Sunday's Childe Newsletter for several months now and decided that since many of us have put so much time, energy and interest into this, Muscular Dystrophy would be a good topic to start this column off with. After all, the least we can do is understand what we are collecting for.

MD is a hereditary disease of the muscle tissue, causing the muscles to become weak and waste away. In almost all cases, it occurs in skeletal muscles, as well as, muscles controlling heart and lung function. MD consists of two common types, Pseudohypertrophic and Facio-Scapulo-Humeral. There are other types of the disease, but these are seen less often.

Pseudohypertrophic (false enlargement) Muscular Dystrophy, gets its name from the apparent overdevelopment of the calf muscles. These muscles appear to be overly large, even though they are actually wasting away, as fat collects in the muscle tissue. The disease most commonly begins in childhood, usually in boys around the age of 5. The victims of this type of MD are generally confined to a wheelchair by age 12 and die before age 20 as lung and heart function are impaired.

Facio-Scapulo-Humeral Muscular Dystrophy is common among both males and females and does not appear until early teens. It affects almost all of the muscles in the body but does not progress as rapidly. The patient may be able to work until age 30 or 40.

As I mentioned before, there are other forms of MD. All of which affect the muscle tissue in similar ways. All are progressive, disabling, and have no effective cure at this time.



MEDICAL COLUMN

WARNING !! Hepatitis is rampant in the valley's gay community right now. If you have been feeling generally worn down, experienced any yellowing of the white of the eyes or other mucus membranes see your doctor immediately. Other symptoms to be aware of are darkening of the urine, whitening of feces or itching of the joints. If you have noticed one or more of these symptoms, or if you have been in contact with anyone who has complained of these things, have it checked out. Hepatitis is treated with a Gamma Globulin injection which is only effective for a few days before or after exposure. Thus, it is important that you be innoculated immediately after exposure.
