ELECTION DAY IS NEXT TUESDAY, AND IT IS EVERY REGISTERED CITIZENS RIGHT AND DUTY TO VOTE ON THAT

DAY. IT IS EVEN MORE IMPORTANT THAT EVERY REGISTERED GAY PERSON IN THE STATE VOTE AND SHOW OUR

STRENGTH IN A UNITED VOTE. THE QUESTIONS ASKED IN THIS LATEST CCR POLL ARE PERTINENT TO EVERY GAY

MAN AND LESBIAN WOMAN IN THIS STATE. TWO OF THE QUESTIONS PERTAIN TO SEXUAL OR AFFECTIONAL PREFER
ENCE/BEHAVIOR. THE OTHER ASKS THE CANDIDATES SPECIFICALLY FOR THEIR VIEWS ON SUPPORT FOR THE EQUAL

RIGHTS AMENDMENT. THE ACTUAL QUESTIONS AS ASKED WERE:

- 1. DO YOU SUPPORT DECRIMINALIZATION OF PRIVATE CONSENTING ADULT SEXUAL BEHAVIOR?
- 2. DO YOU SUPPORT CONFIRMATION OF THE EQUAL RIGHTS AMENDMENT TO THE U.S. CONSTITUTION IN 1979?
- 3. WOULD YOU SUPPORT LEGISLATION THAT WOULD PROHIBIT DISCRIMINATION BASED ON SEXUAL OR AFFECTIONAL PREFERENCE?

News Briefs BIAS IN CONGRESS

PHOENIX BAR BURGLARIZED

PHOENIX - The Forum/Boardwalk was broken into and burglarized on Wednesday night of last week, October 25, sometime after the bar had closed for the night. The intruder broke into the office and made off with a large sum of money and cases of liquor, also coind were taken from the various machines on the premises.

INFORMATION AND REFERRAL MEET WITH TUCSON GAYS

TUCSON - On Thursday, October 26, members of the Tucson Gay community met with staff and management of Information and Referral (I&R). The purpose of this meeting was to set up an information and emergency crisis line for the Gay community. Now instead of several different calls to various organizations it is now possible to make one phone call to get the response or action that is needed.

Representing the Gay community at the meeting were Jim Smith, Director of GCS; Beverly Ginn, Gay Coalition and ANI; Phil Oliver, Director GSO Peer Counseling and Theresa Terry representing Arizona Gay Youth. Each gave a ten minute talk to the I&R representatives outlining the problems and resources that arise in their respective places in the Gay community. After the talks, the meeting was open to discussion and questions. Many questions were asked, discussed and answered.

Plans are being made to distribute posters to various locations throughout the city. The AGN and Tucson Gay Coalition Newsletter will be providing additional promotional space. NAZI GROUP OFFERS TO HELP BRIGGS

LOS ANGELES (GayLife) - A California Nazi group has volunteered to help the Briggs forces pass the anti-Gay initiative Proposition 6, but that offer of assistance has been turned down. The Nazi organization, the National Socialist White Peoples Party, sent a letter to state Senator John Briggs, endorsing Prop. 6 and offering to supply speakers in support of the amendment as well as authorizing Briggs to use the party name in his publicity.

A spokesperson for Briggs said the senator would be "repulsed" by such a letter but claimed that it had never arrived at the Briggs campaign office. A staff member for the National Socialist White People's Party, which is headquartered in Arlington, Virginia, estimated that party membership in Orange County is 50 persons. He continued, "Our storm troops section is always ready to take to the streets in support of our policy. If needed for a demonstration or counter demonstrations, we could put a small, but effective force into action.

WASHINGTON, DC (GCN) - A bill that would have had the U.S. House of Representatives set up a structure for aggrieved congressional employees died in the waning days of the recently adjourned Congress. The measure, introduced by Rep Morris Udall of Arizona and Rep. Patricia Schroeder (D-Colo) did not even get a reading as congress rushed to adjournment.

Udall and Schroeder said their measure would provide "the missing teeth" needed to ensure fairness on Capitol Hill. Their action followed a year old study which showed favoritism for white males over blacks and women in hiring and in the positions they hold and in salaries paid. Before the death of their proposal, Udall and Schroeder stated it was time for the House to adopt the legislation to end its reputation as the nation's "last plantation."

LEGISLATOR DIES AT MIAMI BATHS

MIAMI (GayLife) - A Pennsylvania state legislator, who was regarded as a "super patriot" and a "straight arrow" politician, was recently found dead of a heart attack in the Club Miami, one of the city's more popular Gay bathhouses. State representative William Shuman, 57, held the Silver Beaver, the top award of the Boy Scouts of America, and was active in both the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Miami Police said that Shuman collapsed and died of a heart attack on his way to the whirlpool approximately 4 hours after entering the bath.


Episcopal priest blasts Prop. 6, reveals he's gay

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) - Episcopal priest Rev. William H. Barcus III, delivered a broadside against Proposition 6, the anti-Gay Initiative, in his sermon last Sunday, then revealed to the congregation he is homosexual. Barcus, 43, told three successive groups of parishioners of his homosexuality at the Church of Saint Mary The Virgin.

"I take upon myself the mantel of outcast," Barcus said. "I must stand with my people, Gay people, I must stand for their sake, for my soul's sake, for your sake."

The anti-Gay initiative would prohibit the hiring or retention of schoolteachers who advocate homosexuality. opponents of the measure contend current laws already protect children and such a measure would trigger witch hunts.

One parishioner, upon hearing of Barcus' announcement, commented, "We loved Bill last week and we love him this week."







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PARENTS AND FRIENDS OF GAYS INCORPORATE

PHOENIX - One the 12th of September, a group calling themselves the United Parents and Friends Support Group was officially incorporated by the State of Arizona. As you probably can guess, that name is legal-eese for Phoenix Parends and Friends group that has been meeting more or less informally for quite some time. Back in July, the group had a meeting and decided that there were a number of services and activities that were very much needed by the Phoenix Gay community. They also realized that they were an ideal group to sponsor and/or run such services. Their membership is primarily non-Gay while still being vitally concerned with the welfare of Gay people, since "They are the membership's children." It would be hard to accuse such a group of Prostelytizing."

The next step was to make the group a legal body so that it could do things like raise tax-deductible donations, hold property, run programs and the like. The articles of Incorporation were written broadly enough so that the group can sponsor just about anything that they feel is needed. Some of the services that have been proposed include rap groups, recreational activities and counseling for Gay people who are not yet 19-yearsold and a hostel-type residence to provide food, shelter, counseling and job-finding assistance for homeless Gay Youths.

Not all of the organization's energies have gone into future planning. They are currently providing crisis counseling for parents who have just received news about their child's sexual preferences. Parent counseling is also provided in another way. Part of every meeting is set aside for discussing the problems, feelings and joys of being a parent of Gay persons. The group's most ambitious undertaking has been the sponsorship of The Phoenix Street Project. This is an outreach service, staffed by volunteer mental health and social work professionals, which is providing cirsis counseling and job-finding assistance (legitimate, permanent jobs) for Phoenix's young street hustlers.

If you are a parent or a foster parent of a Gay person, or are a non-Gay or Gay professional (lawyer, doctor, social worker, etc.), who has Gay clients, and would like to be a part of this organization, call Mrs. Faith Parker at 957-1738 for the location of the November 6 meeting. Monthly meetins are on the first Monday of each month at 7:30 p.m.

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

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Editorial

Next Tuesday, November 7, Pima County voters will be asked to determine whether 12 Superior Court judges should remain in office. Under the state's Merit Selection System, the ballot asks only whether the judge should be retained - yes or no.

Because of this, we must go back to June 6, 1976, a date that every Gay person in the City of Tucson should remember. In the evening, on that date, Richard Heakin — a student at the University of Nebraska, in Tucson visiting friends — was brutally murdered as he was leaving the old Stonewall bar. Four youths, who were admittedly out to bash some queers, were indicted for participating in the murder. In October, 1976, the four were brought to trial before Judge Ben C. Birdsall. Judge Birdsall allowed the original charge of murder to be changed to Involuntary Mansalughter and subsequently put the four on probation until they were twenty—one.

Just recently, reporters from Tucson's Arizona Daily Star did an evaluation of the 12 judges using various statistical resources, including the poll conducted by the State Bar of Arizona. Local attorneys, the report says, agree that their strongest criticism of Superior Court judge Ben C. Birdsall is his thin skin. They say the 10 year veteran judge has proven he is too sensitive to public criticism. Many attorneys say that Birdsall, 55, has recently been overracting to criticism leveled against him when he put the four teenagers on probation in the Heakin murder. Since that time, the attorneys say privately, the judge has — at least in two cases — imposed the death sentence in questionable murder sentences.


The Gay community and many, many non-Gay citizens were outraged at the time, for the poor judgement in the Heakin case. True - what is done is done, and Judge Birdsall has since judged many cases, and true - of the 172 local attorneys rating the judge, 95% recommended that he be kept as a Superior Court judge. I would probably have to do the same if I were an attorney with the likelihood of appearing before him in the future. But - we sincerely question the competency of a man who shows so little concern for human life that he would allow four persons who did, in fact participate in a murder, back out on the streets with only the warning that they should finish school and not drink until they are of age. We question the competency of this judge when he allowed the original charge of murder in the Heakin slaying to be changed to Involuntary Manslaughter. We question the competency of this same judge to sit in judgement, who although consistently rated as "overall satisfactory" by the local attorneys, was also mildly criticized for occasionally playing favorites in the courtoom with attorneys he knew well.

We cannot forget the anguish of Richard Heakin's parents who had to have the body of their son shipped back to Nebraska for burial only a few days after he left for a vacation in Tucson. We cannot forget the intense feelings and overall dispair of the Tucson Gay Community - not only at the actual murder - but the completely unfair 1976 decision of Judge Ben C. Birdsall.

Tuesday, November 7, Pima County voters will be asked to vote yes or no on whether to keep Judge Birdsall and the 11 other Superior Court judges. If any of the 12 do not get at least 50% yes votes, they would be removed from office and a replacement would be appointed by the Governor. When you go to the secrecy of the voting booth, we ask that you use your good conscience when you cast your yes or no vote for Judge Ben C. Birdsall. We, personally hold no vendetta, but we are having a very difficult time forgetting the past.


UP FROM THE ASHES



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DOING AMERICA WITH BOB DAMRON

SALT LAKE CITY

Salt Lake City was founded by Bringham Young and his band of Mormon followers in 1847. Among that group who crossed the country in covered wagons was my great-great-grandmother. That is how I came to be a Mormon, or member of the L.D.S. (Not to be confused with L.S.D.), the normal name for the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter-Day Saints. I shall never forget the day I was dunked under water and baptised. For months in advance I lived in mortal fear that I was going to be drowned.

The sagebrush laden desert where my pioneer ancestors settled is today a clean, attractive sprawling metropolis nestled in the foothills between the Rockies and the Great Salt Lake. With a population approaching half a million, it is the largest city and one of the best 'rest stops' between Denver and San Francisco.

I doubt that anything could possible more screwed-up than the way Salt Lake City's streets are numbered, unless it is Utah's antiquated liquour Laws. Many restaurants are 'dry' and very few serve cocktails. Some offer on-premises mini liquor stores, where you can purchase miniatures and order 'set ups' while still others permit you to BYOB or wine. Gay bars only sell beer, but you can 'brown bag' a bottle of your favorite hooch. Bars are open daily until 2 a.m. during Daylight Savings Time, but close at 1 a.m. the rest of the year.

Currently there are only five gay bars, but a couple of others may be opening soon. 'Hottest' by far with the boogie bunch is the Sun Tavern located at #1 South 400 West or 400 West South Temple, depending upon which way you decipher it. Any way, it is opposite the old Union Pacific Depot at W. South Temple and 4th St. (which used to be 3rd) When 'straights' invaded, owner Joe Redburn installed a big sign which reads "The Sun Tavern was built for the gay community. Lets keep it that way". Hooray for Joe, who is also running for a seat in the state legislature.

The Comeback at 551 So. 300 West (3rd St.) has weekend-shows. Sunday brunches and Wednesday night spaghetti feeds. Diesel dikes frequent the Uptown Lounge, next to the 'Sun', and believe me, guys are not welcome. The Rail at 363 West South Temple is a small cruise bar, but rumor hazzit maybe changing names to Crazy Pete's. The oldest bar in town is the Radio City on South State St. whose clientelle include sometimes interesting downtown types.

Jeff's Gym is just a name for Club Baths, which can best be described as mediocre. For books and things try the Waking Owl at 1260 East 4th St. South.

The Village Idiot is a 'head' shop on So. State St. Liberty Park is notorious, but street cruising can be dangerous. A former congressman, city official and popular

comedian can all attest to this.

I stay at the Hilton Inn, and for 'straight' dining, I recommend the Balsam Embers, Heather, La Fleur de Lys, Log Haven, Print Shop, and Roof Restaurant atop the Hotel Utah. The Royal Pallace and Ristoranti Della Fontana are unique in that they are housed in converted churches, not Mormon of course. Points of interest include the Mormon Temple and Tabernacle, State Capitol, University of Utah, Salt Palace, Trolley Square and nearby Ski resorts.

But above all is the Mormon Church which dominates most commerce, industry, government and philosophy throughout the state. My mother still recalls a childhood 'crush' she had for Spencer Kimball, now president and spiritual head of the five million worldwide Mormons. The news media reported recently that Kimball had a 'talk' with God and Blacks can now be ordained into the Church. No such luck for homosexuals, who are still taboo. It was this sort of hypocracy which led me to 'drop out' of the Church in my early teens.

Last but not least, and this pretty well sums up Utah, the Donnie & Marie Osmond show is filmed here. Presumably they are better Mormons than I am? (For more detailed information, pick up a copy of the BOB DAMRON ADDRESS BOOK 1979 --America's foremost travel guide-available at most better bars, baths, and book stores throughout America.
