OPEN LETTER

TO THE EDITOR: AN OPEN LETTER TO HARPO'S OF PHOENIX

At or about 2:30 a.m., November 1st, after an after hours disco party for your patrons, three (3) of those patrons were leaving to go home. Outside of your bar, they noticed 9 or 10 men dragging a single man from his vehicle and then proceeding to violently beat him. The man they were beating is GAY, the attackers are straight.

Your 3 patrons who were leaving tried to intervene. They, in turn, were attacked and severely beaten. Approximately 25 people from your party were standing outside of Harpo's when this occurred. Your guests attempted to return to Harpo's calling for HELP, nothing happened.

When the Phoenix Police Department finally arrived, a half an hour later, they succeeded in rounding up six of the attackers. While the P.P.D. interviewed <u>YOUR PATRONS</u> <u>THAT WERE BEATEN UP</u>, at least three of the attackers, not rounded up, were concealed just a few feet away in some bushes, jeering and vilifying your attacked patrons with such epithets as "fags", "queers", etc. THE POLICE DID NOTHING ABOUT THEM AT ALL!

Later, the police told your attacked patrons that they could not sign a complaint due to the fact there would be no charges against the attackers because it was your patrons word against the attackers. This occurred because, to QUOTE the police "...OF THE TYPE OF ESTABLISHMENT THEY (your patrons) WERE LEAVING".

Since it is now apparent the Phoenix Police Department will not protect taxpayers that are Gay, WE DEMAND TO KNOW what steps, if any, Harpo's plans to take to insure that this will not happen again TO IT'S PATRONS.

EDITORS COMMENT: NOW WAIT JUST A MINUTE! Here is another case of a person getting beaten up outside of a Gay bar. It is terrible! However, the content of this letter from the Phoenix Levi Leather Club seems to be pointing the finger of guilt solely on the owners of Harpo's, when in fact, the incident did not occur on his property. Owners of bars are, and should be, responsible for their patrons while inside their establishments and outside, at least to the perimeters of their parking areas. True, if Harpo's had a security guard on duty on the outside of their establishment, the police could have been called earlier, or he could have helped by engaging in the fisticuffs (which he would not necessarily have had to do, since the incident occurred off of the licensed property.

There are a couple of other factors here that are important also. First, where were those patrons outside the bar when they were needed? Twenty-five or thirty people standing together could surely scare off a band of six to

Policeman indicted in Houston slaying

HOUSTON, TX (GCN) - A Harris County grand jury here has indicted a Houston police officer of negligent homicide in the June 28 shooting death of Houston Gay political Caucus secretary Fred Paez. (AGN 25 July). The twelve member jury alleged that Officer Kevin M. McCoy acted negligently when he placed a "loaded, cocked, pistol against the head of Paez." The gun discharged and resulted in Parz's death. McCoy had testified that Paez made sexual advances toward him and that Paez resisted when he tried to arrest him. McCoy said that the gun went off "accidentally," a statement that is backed by the findings of the Harris County medical examiner.

Lesbian and Gay leaders have discounted the idea that Paez would have resisted arrest, saying that Paez was a "police buff" who was familiar with routine police procedures. Lee Harrington, president of Houston's Gay Political Caucus, hailed the indictment as a victory for justice. "I think that this lets the city know that we (the Lesbian and Gay community) are not going to tolerate another situation where a Houston police officer abuses a citizen because that citizen is Gay," said Harrington.

Police officials are shocked by the indictment, claiming that it was "politically motivated" and a "mistake." Police union officials also questioned whether Lesbian and Gay community leaders should have been allowed to testify in the three-day proceedings, saying that the Lesbian and Gay leaders were not witnesses and should not have testified. If convicted, McCoy could face a sentence of up to one year in jail and a maximum fine of \$2,000. Police union members said that they would be collecting money to help in the defense of McCoy.

heiston Lesbians and Gay males are concerned with the possible outcome of the indictment. Ray Hill, a member of the Gay Community Task Force which investigated the Paez case, told participants at a recent forum that he feels Houston police will be receiving an "open license to kill queers" if McCoy is found not guilty.

Federal prisons to admit Gay publications

WASHINGTON, DC - The Federal Bureau of Prisons has agreed to admit Gay publications into federal prisons. The decision is the centerpiece of an out-of-court settlement in the case of the National Gay Task Force (NGTF) et al vs. Carlson, a lawsuit filed in May, 1977 by Lambda Legal Defense and Education Fund on behalf of several Gay publications which had been excluded from federal prisons. The settlement was approved by the Federal District Court of Washington, DC, and will be monitored by the parties for six months.

ten muggers! In numbers there is strength. In this incident the muggers had the numbers since the Gay community numbers refused to become involved!

More importantly, the Phoenix Police Department is totally to blame for this incident and the numerous others that are reported all too frequently. As long as these queer bashers know that the police department is going to do nothing to them, as long as they beat up people outside Gay establishments, the situation will only proliferate. Pressure must be brought to bear by an alliance of bar owners and community leaders with the Mayor's Liaison office with police officials. This situation must stop! Our Gay community members must be protected by lawful means before the situation gets completely out of control and armed bands of criminals meet head on with armed bands of Gays. Stonewall repeated? Possibly, unless the Phoenix Police Department get with a program to protect all citizens on an equal basis regardless of who they are or what establishment they are coming from.

To single out Harpo's is not being fair to them. Incidents are happening almost daily at all the bars in Phoenix (and Tucson as well). It happens less frequently

Under terms of the settlement, homosexual publications, per se, will not be excluded from the prisons. The settlement provides that homosexual publications of a news or informational nature, literary publications or publications of Gay religious groups should be admitted. Under certain circumstances, a local warden may exclude sexually explicit material, although this material may be admitted it it has scholarly, general social or literary value. The Bureau of Prisons will issue a directive to all wardens incorporating these points.

"This settlement is another success for Gay people, specially for those incarcerated Lesbians and Gay men who find themselves isolated and cut off from any source of Gay community support," commented NGTF Co-Director Charles

PHOENIX MORAL MAJORITY RALLY DRAWS 1,000

PHOENIX -Last Tuesday, Phoenix became the 31st state capital to host a rally by the Rev. Jerry Falwell, founder of the controversial Moral Majority. Nearly 1,000 people attended the rally the mall of the State Capitol complex, at which Falwell called for morality in government and politics. The Lynchburg, Va., preacher said Christians have been forced into politics by recent court and government decisions, like the Supreme Court's 1973 ruling allowing abortion.

Falwell's opponents carried signs bearing such slogans as "Christ fed the poor - Moral Majority feeds fear." In reference to two homosexuals carrying signs, Falwell said, "I think you're moral perverts, but God loves you. I'd die for your right to do what you're doing." Falwell predicted that 90 percent of the two-millionmember Moral Majority would vote on election day for the Republican presidential candidate, former California Gov. Ronald Reagan.

EAST OAKLAND, CA (GayLife) - Former rock and roll singer Little Richard has taken his new act on the road as a Seventh Day Adventist preacher. "All homosexuals are not bad people," says Little Richard in his new act. "A Gay fellow will do you a favor before anybody else will. They're good people, but a lot of them don't know that what they're doing is wrong. Some of them think they're born like that. But if I'd been born like that, I wouldn't have been named Richard. I would have been named Ethel." His comments on the Bay Area were: "This is the biggest unnatural area in the world. There's more unnatural affection up here than anywhere in the world." You don't know who you're talking to. If there are any Gay people here tonight, don't you get mad with me. I am still your brother but. . . I am not here to compromise with Satan." The preacher/ singer also expressed his happiness at the fact that Jesus had "died for me." in spite of his being homosexual.




WOMEN LOVING WOMEN PRESENTATION
