L.A.D.S. Thanks Community For Monte Carlo Night Success

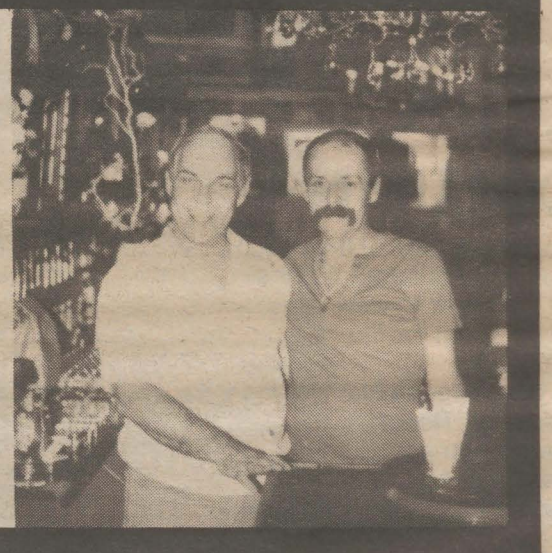

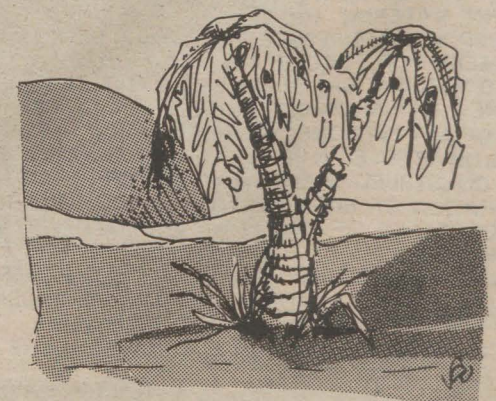
A.I.D.S. FUNDRAISER AT VEGAS WORLD

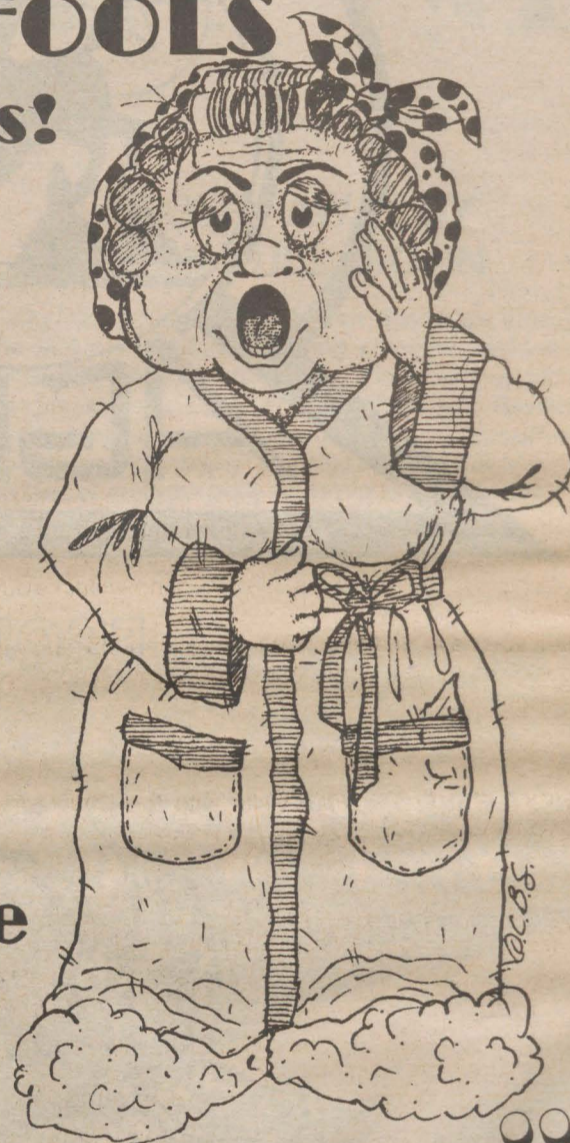

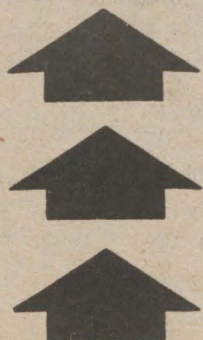

FROM THE ACCOUNTANT'S DESK

More individuals are receiving Federal income tax refunds but still owing Arizona income tax. If you find yourself in this position, now's the time to do something for 1985. Effective January 1, 1985, the 10% withholding option is eliminated for taxpayers earning \$15,000 or more per year in wages, bonuses, overtime and other compensation. Withholding at the rate of 15% or 20% of the federal withholding amount is now required for these taxpayers. If you are paid the following wages or more, I recommend you consider the 15% or 20% rate:

\$7.21/hour, \$288.46/week, \$576.92/2-weeks, \$625/half month, \$1,250/month.

PR BUSINESS REVIEW FIRST TRAVEL

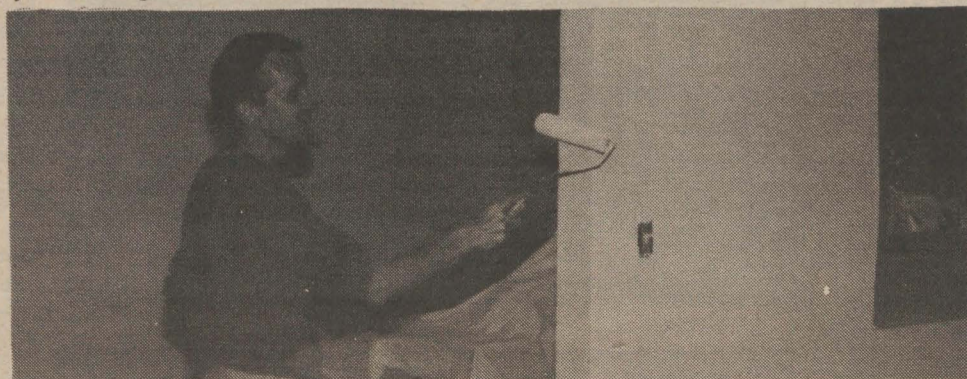
Sam Worthington has been in the travel industry for some five and a half years now and in January 1984 he opened First Travel in its present location at 5150 North 7th Street. The original two rooms have expanded with the business and the offices are now in the final stages of completion at more than triple the original size. Karyl, First Travel's able manager (we know she's able, she trained Sam in the business), has been involved in the industry for a good ten years.

A full service outfit, First Travel can put you on a boat or a plane in a hotel or a tent, for business or for pleasure. About 50% of their clients are gay.

We have all noticed the outrageously low fares offered in the current price war. In paying 30 days in advance the airlines gain your dollars for working capital. The drawbacks are limited to space availability, cancellation penalties, and limited choice for times. However, they do give you the opportunity to save at least 50%. (\$109 to Philadelphia—at the price, it could be worth going there.)

They are now booking reservations for an all gay cruise departing New Orleans to Key West, on to Cozumel, and back to New Orleans. The sailing date is February 15, 1986 and there are only 368 cabins with bookings coming in from all over the U.S., to it's time to get in with your deposit. This voyage is being put together by RSVP Productions of Minneapolis and is geared for men but RSVP is branching out with a women's division later this year. There are a variety of fares offered depending on cabin choice and the prices include *everything* but your tips.

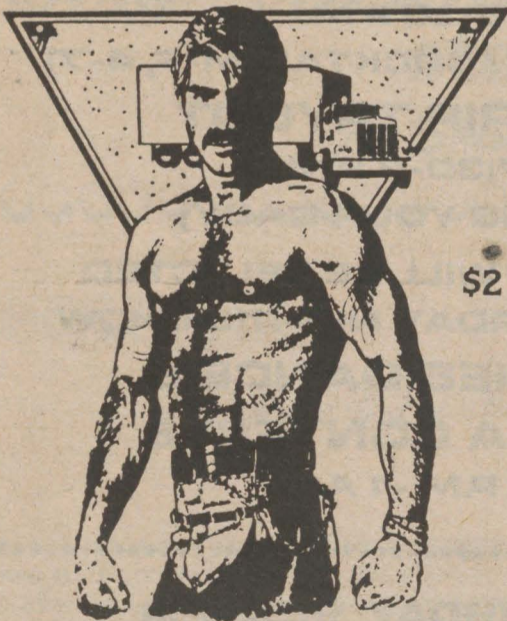

WELCOME APOLLO'S

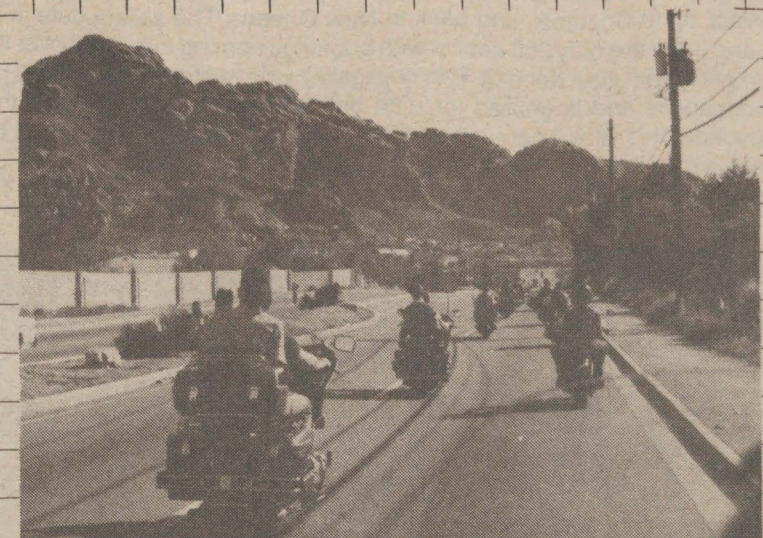

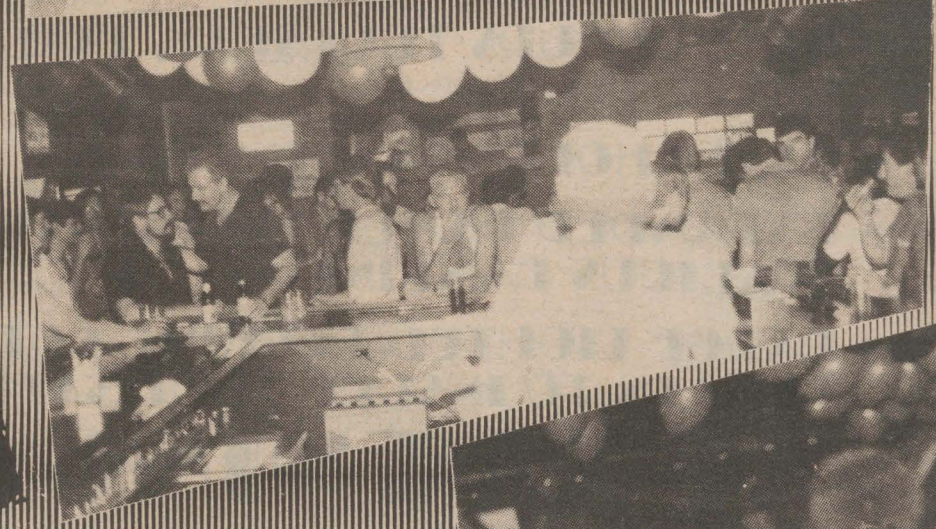
RAMROD

DR. GREEN JEANS PLANT CARE

Description:

Spathiphyllum is an evergreen plant grown for foliage as well as flowers. Dark green feather shaped leaves have indented veins and slightly rippled edges. Blooms on long thin stems consist of a Spathe and a Spadix. They are bright white and lily-like (thus the Peace Lily). Blooms will last for months. They can be cut and will last in water for a long time.

Care:

Light: Spats will thrive in moderate low light to filtered high light, but will only bloom in medium light or bright light.

Watering:

Spats like to be on the damp side. Now, this does not mean soggy, just avoid letting them dry out completely. Underwatering will result in browning of leaf edges.

Feeding:

Be careful not to over fertilize; use 1/2 doses and never use fertilizer on dry roots. Pre-soak or use the feeding method discussed in PR Issue #1.

Spats range in size from small table plants to 4' tall floor plants. The leaves can be up to 18" long. This makes the Spathiphyllum a very dramatic addition to almost any setting. It is very easy to keep looking good as long as you keep it from drying out and, remember, this plant's ability to exist in low light situations. There are not very many plants this can be said about. A real good trick is to keep two Spats and rotate them — keep one in bright light until it blooms, then exchange it for one in a dark area. This way you can obtain blooms on both plants.

ALISON MOYET

“ALF”

(Columbia; Produced by Tony Swain and Steve Jolley)

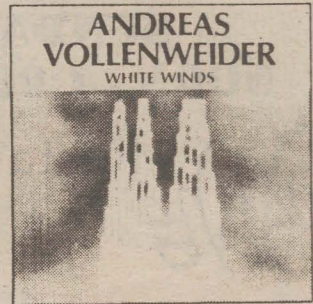
Not surprisingly, Alison Moyet's solo debut is reminiscent of her previous work with Yazoo. Nor is it unusual that she chooses to take a shot at the customary "he done me wrong" theme so prevalent here.

What is surprising is that the LP is both consistent and consistently exciting. Moyet's muscular contralto breathes life into some rather tired themes, insinuating a desperation beyond the lyrics.

"Invisible" might easily have sunk into Vegas-y schmaltz as handled by another vocalist. Moyet's angry reading lifts the ballad from its dirge-like possibilities, softening her mad-as-hell vocal with admirable restraint.

The sexual innuendo of "Love Resurrection" builds slowly, climaxing in a rocking vocal chorus behind Moyet's woeful wailing. The intimation of the lyric is masked in Moyet's androgynous style, and becomes apparent upon a second listen.

Moyet leans heavily on this vocal androgyny. She keeps us guessing in what is overall a very polished and exciting solo effort.



ANDREAS VOLLENWEIDER “WHITE WINDS”

(Columbia; Produced by Andreas Vollenweider)

More entertaining than the beautiful music of "White Winds" is the notion that a classical harpist can assemble a collection of sounds which does not repeat the mood or feel of his two preceding LPs.

This is less a collection of songs than a series of esoteric reflections on nature and the elements. "White Winds" gracefully bestows a cacophony of strings and elemental effects.

Sounds of water, wind and rain are portrayed by Vollenweider's harps, drenching us in a journey through these melodic winds. A myriad of instruments voice the murmur of day and night, interwoven with prevalent strings.

A stirring, relaxed exercise bound with the simple beauty of electric and acoustic harps, violin and cello.



HAZELL DEAN

“HEART FIRST”

(Proto Export; Produced by Pete Waterman)

Gone, apparently, are the days of French Imported disco divas. Hazell Dean resembles somebody's mother, a spandex housewife lost forever in Studio 54.

Appearances aside, Dean offers tons of enjoyable disco foo-foo here, with the dance beats secondary to her large voice.

And while nothing here has the heat of last year's "Searchin," there are some pleasant surprises. The routine cha-cha of "Back In My Arms" is graced with an infectious dubbed-echo vocal. "Whatever I Do" incorporates a wall-of-handclaps into a tedium of studio mechanics. And the strikingly pop-flavored "Young Boy In The City" affords Dean a well-handled turn at pop vocalizing.

This package succeeds more as a heap of nice techno-dance numbers than a showcase for Dean's talents as a vocalist. Yet her vocal attack shines through in a collection geared toward her considerable cult following.



JENNY BURTON

“JENNY BURTON”

(Atlantic; Produced by Eddie O'Loughlin and Lou Debiase)

Wholesale borrowings from seemingly every Arthur Baker production of last year make this LP sound altogether too familiar.

Here, as in Baker's work, O'Loughlin and Debiase are the stars. Another of those "producer albums," pitting the vocalist against the featured drum machine and studio effects.

Burton occasionally manages to overcome the ample production. She shouts her way to the fore in the John-Robie "Load It Up" and efficiently slices through the mix of "Bad Habits," the single.

"Habits" lifts the melody line and synth-hook of Barbara Mason's "Another Man" of last year, and incorporates a thudding bass line. Similarities aside, this is the best offering here.

Though the singer is all but vacuous in a myriad of musical mechanics, it is difficult to deny Miss Burton's vocal abilities. But lost she is here, in a cloud of mostly forgettable studio exercises.

LEATHERNOTES

The Care and Feeding of Leather

Leather is a natural material. Just like our own skin, the hide of other animals, cows, bulls, sheep, goats, horses, pigs or snakes, is grown. Not being a manufactured product, leather is irregular in texture and grain. Just as our own skin requires special care and feeding daily so our leather clothing and toys require as much care when used frequently. All leathers need special care in order to preserve the qualities of aroma, softness, durability, and pliability.

To insure the qualities in your leather are preserved, first, it must be kept clean, just like your own skin. Certain steps should be followed in the process of cleaning leather. Heavy dirt or spots should be removed with a wet cloth or brush. Then a mild detergent (Ivory dish soap, Woolite) can be sparingly applied to a wet cloth to remove sweat stains, grease spots, beer, or champagne spills. Thoroughly dry the washed area. Do not wear the leather damp. Wet leather stretches and the treated area, especially knees and crotch, will lose their shape. Some lightweight leather items such as Cabretta or half-ounce cowskin pouches, tank tops, t-shirts or shorts can be cleaned by placing them in the washing machine using the gentle cycle and a small amount of gentle detergent. Do not allow the cycle to finish, spin dry will alter the shape of your garment. After the rinse, gently work any excess water from the leather and either lay it out flat on a towel or hang from a plastic hanger. This process can be used occasionally on lightweight leathers but heavier items should be professionally cleaned. Such thorough cleaning should only be done when absolutely needed. Petroleum based products are used in the dry cleaning process and frequent use can damage your leather.

After any cleaning process, leather should be generously fed. Detergents and dry cleaning fluids remove most of the natural oils and lanolins from the leather and these must be replaced in order to preserve the appearance and flexibility of the garment. Just as our own skin needs cleaning and rejuvenation, your leather will maintain a newer, youthful look if properly cared for.

Several products are available for feeding your leather. Saddle soaps, mink oil, neatsfoot oil, carnauba cream and atom waxes. Each product is slightly different and each leather owner has their preferences. They are designed to restore aroma, softness and pliability as well as color by preventing aging, brittleness due to salt. These products also provide a degree of waterproofing as well as soil resistance to leathers. Older leathers may be partially restored by thorough cleaning, followed by the generous application of dye and oil, wipe away excess and apply leather sealer, then a final coat of saddle soap or conditioner for aged leather. Finally, an atom wax may be applied to add shine. Careful with waxes, though. Most of them have a tendency to seal the leather fibres and prevent the leather from breathing properly. Leather clothing that has stretched, common in the knee area of pants and chaps, elbows of shirts and under the arm in vests, can be partially returned to a newer look by slightly misting the under or suede side of the hide and allowing to dry. As the water evaporates, it shrinks the leather. When working with dry as well as stretched areas, apply a thick coat of oil to the outside or finished side of the skin. Lay a towel over the area and with a warm iron, press the area until the oil has visually soaked into the skin. Watch that iron, especially on thinner leathers, it won't take much to burn or bubble the leather.

After your leathers are clean, conditioned and well oiled, they should be hung on cuff (pant) hangers, or wooded suit hangers or laid out on plastic protectors to prevent the oil from getting on other clothing. After a short time, the oil will absorb deeply into the leather. When you put them on the next time, take a dry cloth and remove any excess oil. When using hangers on pants or chaps, fold the item differently each time to prevent creases or folds. Rolling pants and chaps when packing leather in suitcases will prevent creases also. Waist bands or belts of pants or chaps should never be sharply folded — insert other clothing inside folded leather.

Obviously, we haven't covered everything, for specific suggestions, feel free to contact us at Tuff Stuff. Keep your leather clean and protected. There is nothing like "well-cared-for" leather on a "well-cared-for" body. Now, that sound like a good lead-in for our next article. How to buy, what to buy.

Now a short list of products that we have found that seem to maintain high quality in leather care: Fiebings Saddle Soap, liquid or paste; Fiebings Saddle Oil with silicone-lanolin; Smiling Mink Leather Waterproof; English Saddle Soap by Zoes; Double Brand Leatherizer; Fiebings Leather Balm and Atom Wax.

Stay away from most Lexol products, Dr. Johnson Leather Balm and Crisco. All three are very rough on your leather. Next time — and Arizona — the best is yet to come.

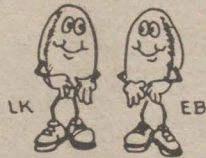

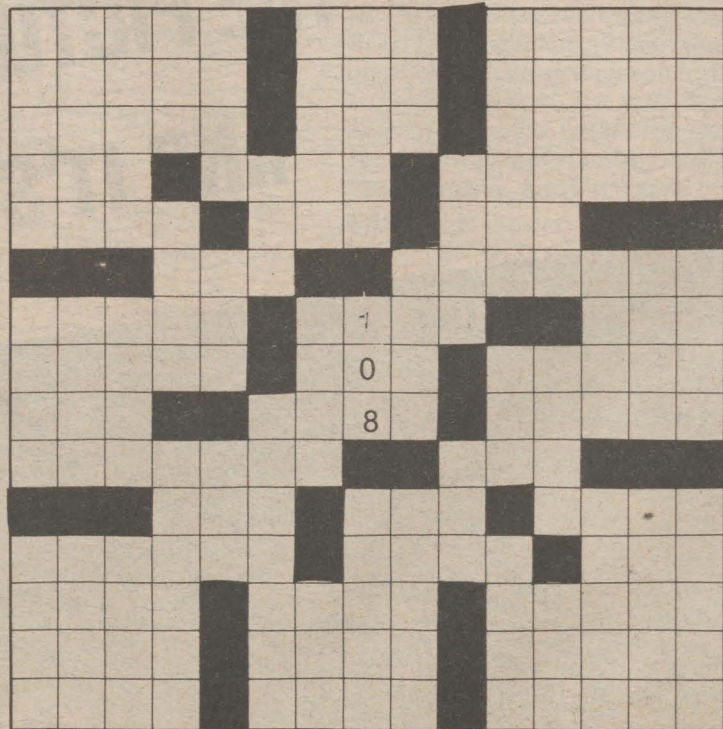

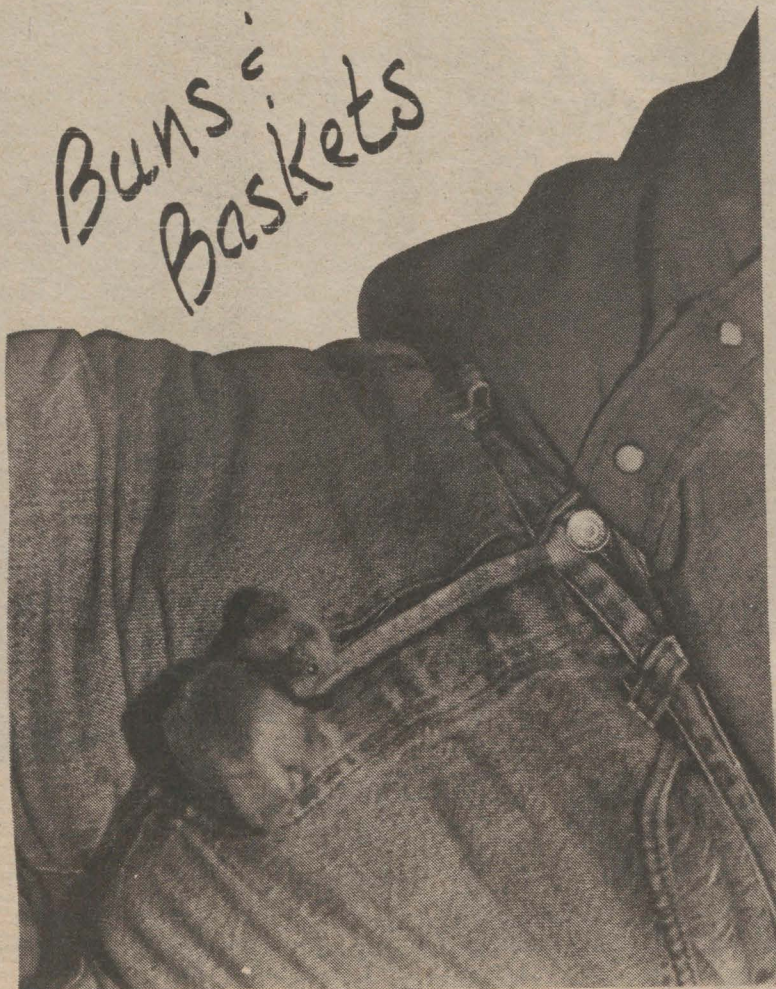
