



CALL FOR WORKSHOP PROPOSALS



Facing It: A Novel of AIDS. Paul Reed, author. San Francisco: Gay Sunshine Press, 1984. 217 pages. \$7.95 paperbound.

Hot Living: Erotic Stories About Safer Sex. John Preston, editor. Boston: Alyson Publications, 1985. 191 pages. \$7.95 paperbound.

It's not going to go away. You probably know at least one person who is...or was...involved with AIDS. If not, you probably know at least one person who will be. These two books are about willingness to take action, for ourselves and the people in our lives.

Facing It tells what it's like to be involved in the illness of AIDS. To my knowledge, this is the first novel about AIDS, and it's the first novel by a young author. From both viewpoints, it's excellent. Characters and motivations are well developed, information is credited, speculations are intuitively plausible. Andy and David are lovers; Andy has AIDS. Reed shows us a sequence of thoughts, feelings, actions, the evolution of love, that will be familiar to too many of us.

Other people are involved. Andy's father forbids Andy's mother and sister to visit, just as he'd forbidden contact since Andy refused to be psychiatrically "cured." One friend continues to offer love and hugs; one is afraid to visit. Andy's doctor is supportive and concerned; hospital staff insists that David isn't family. Some researchers play political football with AIDS research funds, some are dedicated, some are closet gays. Many people find the number of victims not worth the fuss. This is what it's like. It shows you how you can help, and it showed me why I have to help.

And for yourself? If, right now, you don't have AIDS? Is safe sex worth the sacrifice of variety and intensity? **Hot Living** challenges the limits of safe sex. At Alyson's request, Preston asked several established writers to contribute pornography that features safer sex. Yes, this is a self-defined collection of pornography, and no, it's not boring or repetitive or timid or impersonal. The variety and creativity are (among other things) refreshing - there's probably nothing here you couldn't have thought of, and probably a lot that we're simply not used to seeing in the context of safer sex.

Okay...it's not the same. It's not as overpowering or as gratifying as familiar sex - or familiar porn. Preston and his contributors offer possibilities, and leave it to readers to decide, again and again, which sacrifice they'd rather make.

THE SWEET SOUND OF MUSIC

Once upon a time mankind got bored and looked around for some means of entertaining himself and his fellow cavemates. Long forgotten are the specific sources of inspiration. No matter. One can be fairly certain that music-in the form of singing, dancing or pounding on some animal's skin with a stick-was right there in the beginning. More sophisticated instruments followed. Man developed language skills at some point. Hence the appearance of acting troupes and amphitheatres and the like. It was only natural that the two-music and drama-should be put together. Two fine forms of entertainment at the same time. Motion pictures had no sound when they first showed up. If you didn't like the music all you had to do was walk to the front of the place and smack the piano player. With the advent of the 'talkies' it didn't take long for the advent of the 'musical' to happen.

All movies are not musicals. And likewise the other way around. Yet even the flicks that have no hoofing and caterwauling still have a musical soundtrack. And while I'm thinking of it; a bona fide movie musical better have a real good reason for making all that noise.

I like music. Can't say that I know all there is to know about all the different kinds of music. Operas might as well be sung in Greek for all that I would understand. And country music, well, my middle class childhood in Phoenix didn't exactly instill a deep affinity and knowledge for it. If you had asked me a year ago who Patsy Cline was and what songs she was known for I could have answered the first (a singer, of course) but not the latter. Hey-when Patsy was hot, I was a tot.

Sweet Dreams is a film biography of the aforementioned country songbird. Needless to say, certain liberties are probably taken with her story as is usually true with this kind of story. And as you would well expect there is lots of singing. In Sissy Spacek's award-winning performance in Coal Miner's Daughter she opted for doing all the vocalizations herself. That was fine for that particular impersonation. In Dreams the lead is undertaken by the talented Jessica Lange and thankfully the film's makers chose to use Ms. Cline's original vocal tracks with Ms. Lange giving one of the best lip-synch performances I've seen in some time. (Sorry, Sissy) And what a wonderfully surprising choice it is. I was totally unprepared for how damn good she sounds. I even went out and bought the soundtrack. (It's filed somewhere between Donna Summers and South Pacific.)

This movie can't avoid showing us the ups and downs of her rise to popularity but it isn't really what makes this story click. It's the 'ups and downs' (or ins and outs, if you prefer) of her stormy loe life that matters here. Ms. Cline is portrayed s a talented young lady with a lot of gusto for living. Rather than remain married to her first husband in certain—though monotonous—bliss, she divorces him and soon meets up with the virile and cocky Charley Dick (Ed Harris). Their relationship is at once intense and tumultuous. There is never any doubt that they really love (lust) for each other, but the pressures of her career are too much for him. He drinks too much, gets kidded at his job by fellow workers every time the radio plays her songs and occasionally takes it out on her. Yet they keep on coming back for more. Love is like that, you know. Mr. Harris is absolutely terrific in a part that could have easily been o ershadowed by the mercurial presence of Ms. Lange. He holds his own here. (And if that weren't enough he gets to display a little beefcake-and a fine piece of cake it is!) A love story with a twang. It's a two hour visit but how else to fit in all those marvelous songs? If you don't look too closely you might overlook that what we got here is a lotta singin', drinkin,' smokin' and screwin'.

If you aren't already familiar with this lady's life then you'd best be gettin' out to see this movie for yourself, cuz I ain't gonna tell how it ends. All the music and fine acting aside (Ann Wedgeworth is real appealing as Patsy's Mom), it is also well photographed, authentically tuned to its time period and deftly edited. And everytime I listen to the record, I fall to pieces. Sweet Dreams is a very sweet picture.



Can't Get No Satisfaction or How To Stop Worrying and Roll With The Punches

Filmmaker Martin Scorsese has quite a reputation for making odd yet engrossing movies and After Hours is no exception. The story concerns itself with a night in the life of your average office worker, Paul Hackett. out for the evening in a coffee shop with his favorite paperback by Henry Miller, he meets a pretty though slightly dingy young lady, gets invited over to her apartment and no doubt will regret that decision before it is all over with. What happens to him is ordinary enough, for New York anyway. What propels it into the surreal is that it all happens in one night. No one should suffer the indignities this poor guy experiences. He just wants to get laid and what he gets is screwed-royally. An accomplished cast of actors and actresses carry out their madcap tasks with apparent sincerity. At first you might find yourself wondering where this story is going. Thankfully all the pieces eventually fall into place. And while you may not entirely covet the finished product, watching it come together will be one of the most bizarre trips to the theatre you could hope to take. After Hours is quirky, eccentric, and blacker-than-black humorous.



DESCRIPTION:

The Pineapple Plant is appealing to those who like to grow something different. It's stiff, grayish-green, spiny edged leaves are attached to a short, thick stem. The unusual fruit is carried on a stem rising from a rosette of leaves. Several types of Pineapples are grown indoors varying from 15 inches to almost 36 inches tall. Varigated forms may have white or cream stripes in the leaf.

Keep soil moist but not soggy. The only problem is most Pineapples are potted in a crushed lava rock soil base. This is very coarse and difficult to tell just how damp the soil is. My suggestion is to repot the plant in a very airy loose soil mix.

Pineapples require high indoor light levels, Indirect light is preferable but soon direct light will not damage the plant.


FEEDING:

Standard feeding schedule is adequate for Pineapple Plants. A full dose every month or quarter doses with each watering.

NOTES:

These are very interesting plants and easy to care for. But they are not easily found, try ordering from your florist or plant shop.



RHYTHM AND ROMANCE

(Columbia: Produced by David Malloy and Rodney Crowell)

The Women's Country-Rock Mainstream is becoming more of a swamp every day. Linda Ronstadt has left us for the adult contemporary of Twenties Swing; Reba McEntire has denounced her minimal pop leanings for a more traditional country sound. Crystal Gayle has turned her back on Nashville once and for all, and Dolly Parton has sunk into the dredges of commercial banality.

Which leaves us with Rosanne Cash. Cash has, since her 1980 debut "Right or Wrong," built a career on redefining the school of country-rock. Her second album, 1981's "Seven Year Ache," neatly split itself between Nashville and Brill Building, proving that Country Rock (and Cash herself) was still a force to be reckoned with.

On Rhythm and Romance, her fourth album, Rosanne Cash has successfully married her cornpone posturings and pop sensibilities in what amounts to a fulfilling Southern swing around today's Top 40 ideals.

The album, produced by Cash's husband Rodney Crowell, incorporates country and rock, rather than surrending them to separate stylings. The acoustic backdrop and sentimental lyrics of "Closing Time," for example are countered with a Cash vocal which, in its phrasing, is more reminiscent of Elvis Costello than Patsy Cline. Likewise, Waddy Wachtel's ripand-tear guitar work on "Halfway House" belies the countrified theme of the lyric ("Our friends are in a halfway house/You're still on the mend/Don't know if I've changed at all? But I'm in love with you again").

And, while Country Music's women have usually taken on the guise of helpless vulnerability, Cash turns the musical tables and, in the call-and-response

of "I don't Know Why You Don't Want Me," lists her numerous virtues while still clinging to that vulnerability. "Just when I think I can make it without you/You come around and say you want me now/... Why can't you see how much I need you?" sings Cash, in a stoic vocal which clearly says, "... and I really don't care why you don't want me.'



Likewise, the rough-edged "Never Gonna Hurt," with its I-don't-need-your-lovin' lyric, raves on with rock pretenses, only to be skewered by Billy Joe Walker's twangy guitar riffs at the break. It is such quietly countrified nuances such as these which make Cash's work more southern rock than twangand-roll; more palatable than anything her contemporaries have attempted.

It's comforting news that while Crystal, Linda, and Dolly have left us for more vapid musical pastures, we still have the finely tuned strains of Rosanne Cash's Rhythm and Romance.

I'M YOUR WOMAN

(Mercury; Produced by Barry Reynolds)



Sandra Bernhard's press book informs me that she has performed as a standup comic, stage actress, and motion picture star ("The King of Comedy"). She is, her blo goes on to say, try-

ing her hand at rock and roll, in a delightfully entertaining album debut."

Unfortunately, her record label provides no insight into whether or not this is meant to be taken as straight rock and roll or a comedic parody of same.

No matter. I'm Your Woman comes off as neither terribly funny nor musically outstanding. That each of the eight songs is preceded by a decidely un-funny spoken monologue is puzzling enough. Are these soliloquies meant to be humorous, and fall flat only because Bernhard is a craftless comedienne? Or are they meant to stand as gloomy intros to supposedly facetious musical parodies?

The songs themselves provide no answers. While offering sometimes odd imagery ("I wonder/How many people would like my breasts/pressed against theirs"), the lyrics are not especially farcical. Nor do they appear to lampoon anything further than their own pop banality.

Where, then, is the joke? The LP sticker warns, "Contains Language that may not be suitable for children or puritans," though the album is not particularly raunchy. Where, then, is Bernhard's audience?

Given this album's confusing premise, its title seems a bit boastful. By the sounds of things, Sandra Bernhard is nobody's woman.





It is starting to get cooler out there. Definitely. Summer is gone and so are 80° and 90° nights. Now is probably the best time to make one of the largest leather purchases most people make, a leather jacket. Warm, comfortable and versatile, the leather jacket is the most popular piece of leather sold (well, maybe cockrings are really number 1). There are so many variations, styles and weights that every personality can find a jacket that fits both the body and the person. There are some general things to look for when shopping for a jacket no matter what the style or manufacturer. The largest thing is going to be the leather itself. It should feel soft and pliable. Don't confuse light weight with softness. Whatever the weight of the leather, it should not feel rigid like cardboard or vinyl. A properly tanned and dyed jacket, the leather will be pliable to prevent cracking at stress points on the jacket. The leather should also match throughout the jacket. The average jacket is made up of more than fifty separate pieces. These pieces should not look like they came off more than fifty separate pieces. Obviously, leather is not a manufactured material and there will be variations across the length of a skin, but these variations are not dramatic. If the jacket has one panel smooth and the next is grainy, one is shiny and the next is dull, then care has not been taken in putting the jacket together. If they didn't take the time to match the skin, I always wonder what else they didn't take the time to do.

The next feature would be zippers. Here you have to balance style with durability. The most durable zipper is brass. The most stylish zipper is aluminum. And now some jackets are being made with a black plastic zipper called neopreame. It is very attractive but the least durable of the three. The silver of the aluminum zipper, to most, looks the best on the black leather of the jacket. Brass, like I said, is the most durable but is seldom used for two reasons. It is not as popular and is much more expensive. Not all jacket styles are available with the three different zippers. But the style you choose should be purchased with the life of the zipper in mind.

Next look at the lining. Yes, we live in Arizona. But anyone who doesn't think it gets cold here hasn't climbed on a bike at 3:30 in the morning after leaving a nice warm bed to go home. Buddy, it gets plenty cold. For anyone who rides, a guilted lining is a must. Some jackets has a zip-out lining which is fine, but adds to the cost of the jacket. For a leather jacket that is not for biking the quilted lining is still nice but not necessary. A single layered Orlon or Tricot lining will still provide more than enough protection from the cold.

Now, and last, is style. Every manufacturer has several and they are all different enough that one of them should please everyone. Brooks jackets are very fine jackets and come in nine different styles. Two of them lightweight for Spring and Autumn and most of the others have zip-out linings. Other than having one custom made, Brooks is the most expensive manufacturer on the market. The leather used is just a bit on the stiff side and should be oiled regularly. They use the best zippers available and nylon thread on the stitching providing a long life to the jacket. Hein Gericke is also a very good jacket. The leather is the best that we have found. Soft, supple the jacket is very comfortable. They are also available in nine styles. Two are lightweight and one has sleeves that zip off and converts to a vest. Another brand is Golden State collection of Giovanni jackets. Available in sixteen styles and are all lightweight styles. Two other American manufacturers of motorcycle type jackets are Shott Brothers and Perfecto. Well, actually they are the same company and you can tell by the leather they use. On most of their jackets the leather is extremely rigid and mismatched. The zippers are brands we have never heard of and the lining never seems to be attached correctly.

Leather jackets look good on every body. And costs are going to run anywhere from \$130. to \$250. for common styles. It is a very good investment though. With very little care your leather jacket can last for years. They look so good on and smell so good and feel so good. Well, you get the idea. Have you ever laid next to someone naked except for a leather jacket? Well, that's a whole new story




