

## Grand Canyon National Park, ARIZONA NORTH RIM... open summer season only, mid-May to mid-October

## CAMPGROUND, HOUSING, AND MEALS

Campground 3. Free campground with tables, water, fireplaces, wood, sanitary facilities. Free trailer-parking space. No provisions for making utility connections to trailers. Open all summer and until winter precludes camping. Camping limit: 14 days. Campsites are on a first-come, first-served basis.

North Rim Inn 3. Cabins from \$4.50 to \$7.50 for 2 persons. Cafeteria 3 with club meals. Breakfast from 70 cents to \$1.25, lunch from 85 cents to \$1.50, dinner from \$1 to \$2.50. Open about May 15 through second weekend in October.

Grand Canyon Lodge (5). Standard rooms and de luxe cabins from \$4.50 to \$10 for 2 persons. Dining room with breakfast at \$1.50, lunch at \$1.75, dinner at \$3. Open about June 15 through breakfast the day after Labor Day.

## TRIPS

Bus Trips. From Grand Canyon Lodge to Point Imperial, Cape Royal and return. Bus stops for free National Park Service naturalist talk at Cape Royal (a). Leave 1:30 p.m. daily, return 5 p.m. \$3 per person. Make reservations at Grand Canyon Lodge (a).

Mule Trips into Canyon. Leave head of Kaibab Trail (7) daily at 8 a.m., return 4:30 p.m. To Roaring Springs and return, \$13.75, including lunch. Trips to Phantom Ranch or Ribbon Falls, 2 days or more, by special arrangement. Make reservations at Grand Canyon Lodge (5) or advance reservations with Jack Church, Fredonia, Ariz.

Horseback Trips Along Rim. Trips made twice daily. One-half day at \$6 per person. Make reservations at Grand Canyon Lodge 5.

## National Park Service Interpretive Services (Summer season only)

Nature Walk. Conducted daily by ranger-naturalist from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Starts at trailside shelter, east side of lodge parking area (6), to Bright Angel Point and return, approximately three-quarters of a mile.

Cape Royal Talk. Given daily by ranger-naturalist at 3:15 p.m. at Cape Royal lecture circle (9). Covers history and origin of Grand Canyon.

Campfire Program. Given in campfire circle at campground (3) by ranger-naturalist. See bulletin boards for schedules.

Grand Canyon Lodge Talk. Orientation talk by ranger-naturalist each evening at lodge 5, 8:30 p.m. to 8:45 p.m.

Transept Trail (8). Self-guiding nature trail. Starts at cafeteria (3), ends at Bright Angel Point, 1.6 miles.

Cape Royal Trail (9). Self-guiding nature trail, one-fourth mile.

Exhibit Room at Ranger Station 1. Exhibits and relief map. Information service and publications available. Open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

## ENTERTAINMENT

Evening program by Utah Parks Co. employees at lodge 5, at 9 p.m. following naturalist talk. Dancing follows, except on Sunday.

### OTHER SERVICES

Telephone and telegraph service at Grand Canyon Lodge (5). Curios, newsstand, barber shop, fountain, traveler's supplies at lodge and inn (3). Ice and limited supply of groceries at inn. Service station (4). Emergency mechanical repairs at public garage (2). Nurse on duty for first aid at lodge office. Post office in lodge—address North Rim, Rural Station, Fredonia, Ariz.

Church Services. Protestant, Catholic, and Latterday Saints services are usually held on Sundays at Grand Canyon Lodge. Check bulletin board at the lodge for details.

Hiking. The Kaibab Trail from the North Rim is open during the summer. Hikers are cautioned to obtain the bulletin "Information for Hikers" at the North Rim Ranger Station. Anyone planning to travel on any other trails must secure special information and a permit from the district park ranger.

Primitive Road to Point Sublime. This road may be closed at times because of adverse weather conditions or high fire danger.

FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION, CALL AT RANGER STATION (1), 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

NOTE.—Make advance reservations with Utah Parks Co., Cedar City, Utah, or during open season, with that company, North Rim, Rural Station, Fredonia, Ariz.
